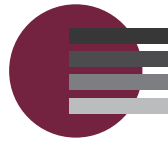

ABOUT US

The Leadership Conservatory for the Arts provides an outstanding opportunity for instrumental, vocal, dance and visual arts students. By extending the nationally acclaimed Tarpon Springs High School Leadership Conservatory for the Arts, this magnet program provides youth with the right tools and constructive environment to allow them to explore, shape and clearly articulate their own vision for the future. Students develop leadership skills, receive advanced instruction in the performing arts, learn the effective use of technology and undertake challenging academics. Parents may elect to enroll their student in the Fine Arts courses only, the PreCambridge courses only, or a combination of both.

ADMISSION CRITERIA

The program is designed for incoming 6th, 7th and 8th grade students who are interested in exploring and developing their leadership skills in the performing and visual arts. Students who want to develop their talent and have the desire to be leaders need to apply. No auditions required. Applicants are expected to have satisfactory discipline, attendance and standardized test records.



areas of study

Leadership development is integrated into all elements of the conservatory's curriculum. We teach that leadership is the ability of a single individual to motivate themselves and others to higher levels of achievement. Our conservatory curriculum also provides each student the opportunity to develop the skills necessary to be a successful student, person of high character and prepared future employee.

The conservatory offers traditional and honors/gifted educational opportunities to accommodate individual capabilities and learning levels. The rigorous academic program integrates the core curriculum disciplines of math, science, social studies and language arts. Going beyond traditional educational methods, the conservatory will work to partner each classroom with a corporate sponsor and adjunct faculty. Due to these unique partnerships, students will be able to transform their passions and personal interests into potential scholarships and promising career goals.

Advanced technology is integrated into all aspects of the learning environment. Our newly updated wireless campus provides connectivity to the Internet and a variety of other software and resources giving conservatory students the capability to experience our unique curriculum through digital means.

Students will be offered ITC technology and Leadership Focus classes as part of the magnet enrichment program.
