Curriculum Corner by Jeane Morehouse, Assistant Principal

I am always involved in classroom instruction and now I am working on FSA preparations and student readiness. A huge part of being successful is believing in one's self. I recently heard the term coach effort from a former high school principal. Coaching effort is encouraging the child to try their best and give 100% effort. It's also important for the child to know their parent, teacher, or coach believes in them. This is true for testing, classwork and other activities in and out of school. There was a basketball study in 1996 by Dr. Blaslotto in which some randomly selected students were divided into three equal skill groups based on their free throw ability. The first group was told not to touch a basketball for 30 days, the second group practiced free throws for 30 minutes a day, and third group was to spend 30 minutes a day visualizing themselves taking free shots and making it in each time. After a month the first group did not improve, the group that practiced improved 24% and the visualization group improved 23%. So if our students continue to learn from their amazing teachers, have time to practice, and believe in themselves and can see themselves as successful they will surely succeed!

Did you know: "When schools, families, and community groups work together to support learning, children tend to do better in school, stay in school longer, and like school more." That's the conclusion of **A New Wave of Evidence**, a report from Southwest Educational Development Laboratory (2002). The report, a synthesis of research on parent involvement over the past decade, also found that, regardless of family income or background, students with involved parents are more likely to:

- Earn higher grades and test scores, and enroll in higher-level programs
- Be promoted, pass their classes, and earn credits
- Attend school regularly



- Have better social skills, show improved behavior, & adapt well to school
- Graduate and go on to postsecondary education (see A New Wave of Evidence, Southwest Educational Development Laboratory, 2002 - in references below). <u>http://www.sedl.org/connections/resources/evidence.pdf</u>

It's not too late to get involved. Just to mention a few things you can do: you can attend parent teacher conferences, join our PTA, email teachers regularly, sign agendas daily, attend SAC meetings, attend Parent Involvement events, read with your child, and check Portal grades weekly.

Positive Reinforcement

Positive reinforcement is the most powerful and useful method of changing or developing behaviors. Unfortunately, good behavior is usually ignored in most homes, at school, and at work. Reinforcement is very familiar to everyone, but it is not used as often as it should be. In fact, if you master the use of positive reinforcement with your child, you will notice really dramatic improvements in behavior. The difficulty is in knowing how to use reinforcement and then in actually using it.

How to make your praise most effective

-Deliver praise when you are near your child. When you are close to your child, you can be sure that the behavior you are praising is taking place. Also, when you are close, your child is more likely to pay attention to what you are saying.

-Use a sincere, enthusiastic tone of voice. You don't need to be loud, but make sure that you sound thrilled about what your child is doing.

-Use nonverbal reinforcement. Show your child you are pleased by smiling, winking, or touching. Hug your child, high five him, or pat him on the back.

-Be specific. When praising your child, say exactly what behavior you approve of. "Wow, thank you so much for picking up your shoes and putting them in the closet." You want to be specific.
