Curriculum Corner by Jeane Morehouse, Assistant Principal

One thing about education is that teachers work *really*, *really* hard. We are working to shift the hardest work to students. Why? We want students to do the big thinking and the awesome brain growing work. How do we do this? We give students some direction and set them off to grapple—in education it is called a *productive struggle*. What does it look like?

<u>Reading:</u> When a student doesn't know how to say a word we may support them in sounding out the letters and then saying all the sounds together. They can also chunk the parts they know. If a child doesn't know what a word means in a sentence we can have them read the words around the unknown words to find clues. After these attempts you can tell you child the word.

<u>Math:</u> We may give them a word problem and have them think about strategies they know to solve it on their own or with friends. If they want our help we can ask them, "What have you tried so far?" When they talk about it out loud or with a peer they may make a connection that deepens their thinking.

<u>Science</u>: We can ask them questions that make them ponder and reflect. We can remind them of a situation that connects to what they are working on. For example, when we tell students water can be a liquid, solid, or gas, we can boil some water and ask them what they see. We can go into the freezer and pull out ice cubes and then talk about it. We can ask them about what they say.

When we, teachers and parents, positively push children to do the thinking, stopping ourselves from telling them the answers, it strengthens their thinking ability. It often takes longer however, the long term results are **investments** in the development of stronger thinkers.





Title I

Parent's Right to Know

As a parent of a student attending a Title I Pinellas County Public School, you have the right to know the professional qualifications of the classroom teachers who instruct your child. Federal law allows you to ask for certain information about your child's classroom teachers and requires us to give you this information in a timely manner if you ask for it. Specifically, you have the right to ask for the following information about each of your child's teachers:

- · Whether the Florida Department of Education has licensed or qualified the teacher for the grades and subjects he or she teaches. · Whether the Florida Department of Education has decided that the teacher can teach in a classroom without being licensed or qualified under state regulations because of circumstances.
- · The teacher's college or major, and any advanced degrees, if so, the subjects and degrees
- · Whether any teachers' aides or similar paraprofessionals provide services to your child, and if they do, their qualifications.
- · Review Principal's Attestations (in the Principal's office and LEA office)
 In addition, you have the right to be provided information on your child's level of achievement on the Florida Standard Assessments. This information will be available at your child's school.
