Message from Fuguitt Principal, Mrs Kathlene Bentley

Dear Fuguitt Families, March is upon us and soon we will be moving into the last quarter of the year. We still have much learning ahead of us. Beginning in April, our 3rd, 4th and 5th grade students will begin taking the Florida Standardized Assessments and Kindergarten, 1st & 2nd will take the spring MAP assessment. By using our [7 habits](#), we can help our students achieve their best! The first habit is **"Be Proactive"**. When we are proactive, we're in charge! Our students need to realize that when they are better prepared, they have more control of the situation. Every day our students build upon prior knowledge to increase their preparedness for taking an assessment and showing what they know! The second leadership habit suggests that, in everything we do, we should **"Begin with the End in Mind"**, which is starting with a clear plan of action. Planning helps our students draw upon skills and strategies to finish the test within the given amount of time. Managing test taking skills effectively, means we must **"Put First Things First"**. Students should work first, then play. This begins with listening closely to test directions as they are read and staying focused on the task at hand throughout the testing period. There may be times during an assessment that a student is not sure of an answer and they find themselves becoming anxious. This is when we can apply the leadership habit **"Think Win-Win"**. By using this habit, a student should eliminate the choices they know are wrong on a question and choose the one they think is the best choice. It is better to answer all

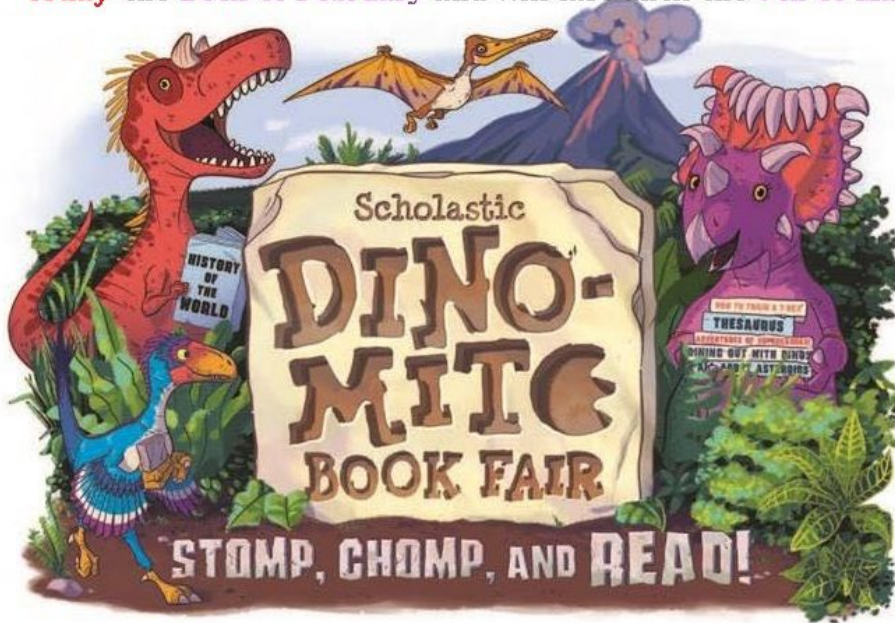
