

## 21st Century Attendance

According to the 21st Century guidelines, students in the program are expected to attend the full hours of the program, 5 days per week, unless an arrangement has been agreed upon with the program manager.

#### **Absences:**

Absence Defined:

A.Student who is not present in class at least 2.5 hours of the class period shall be counted absent from the class. To be counted present for the after school day, the student must have attended the regular school day for at least 3.75 hours.

#### B. Excused Absences:

Student is ill or injured

Student has a medical or dental appointment

Major illness in the student's immediate family

Death in the Family

Student attends a religious event

Student has received a subpoena by the courts

Student is suspected of having communicable disease

## 21st Century Attendance

Students that have excellent attendance in the 21st Century program will receive a quarterly incentive!

Excellent attendance is a student attending 90% or more of program days offered each quarter.

Incentives last year included gift cards, pop-its, art supplies, athletic equipment, and tickets to Astro Skate!

### 21st Century Policy & Procedures

#### **Student Selection:**

Students attending a 21st CCLC school in grades 3–5 are eligible to participate in the program. The program is free of charge to all eligible applicants on first come first serve basis. \*Private school students are welcome to attend the program. Gulfport and High Point program serve students in 2nd-5th grade.

The maximum number of students accepted per school: 60 students - 20 per class \* Students may be placed on a waitlist at the discretion of the school coordinator and/or director of the program if attendance is between 50-60 students. Waitlists may be utilized to ensure enough staff members are available to ensure student's are learning in a safe environment.

In order to be considered, a family member/guardian must fill out a registration form. Registration forms may be submitted electronically or as a hard copy to the school front office or 21st Century staff member.

### 21st Century Policy & Procedures

#### Days of Operation & Hours of Operation:

The days of operation will be Monday – Friday from 3pm - 6pm.

Students will report to the cafeteria after being dismissed from their regular school day class for attendance and snack. The school coordinator or teacher will then walk students to their designated classroom.

The 21st Century program follows the PCS calendar for days of observance, non-student days, breaks, and inclement weather.

### 21st Century Policy & Procedures

#### **Student Discipline:**

Decisions regarding student discipline can be handled by the site coordinator, teacher, and/or program director. Students are expected to follow the guidelines and procedures and any discipline issues will be handled according to the levels described below.

\*\*Please note that depending upon the circumstances, the program administration has the right to dismiss a student due to egregious behavior at any time.

Families will receive a written communication requesting a signature of acknowledgement for any behavior that is considered Level 2-4. This form will need to be provided prior to the student returning to the program.

Level One - Verbal Warning with students

Level Two -Discussion with parent/guardian – possible meeting

Level Three - Student suspended from 21st century iClass up to 3 days

Level Four - Program Dismissal – Student will no longer be able to attend the program

### 21st Century End of Day Dismissal

Parents are responsible for ensuring that students have transportation home after the program. It is the expectation that parents are on-time (**6:00 pm**) to pick up students at the conclusion of the program hours. On the application, it is important that you designate how your child will be going home.

Walker – Student walks home after the program. A student is considered a walker even if a parent/sibling escorts the student home.

Car Rider/Parent Pick-Up – Student will be picked up by a vehicle in the designated area.

Bike Rider – Student rides home on their bikes.

\*\*\* Students that are bike riders and walkers will be dismissed from the program early during daylight savings time when daylight hours are shortened.

This information will be kept on file and students will be released ONLY to contacts identified on the application.

### 21st Century End of Day Dismissal

Students that are picked up more than 10 minutes late will receive a late pick-up notice.

1st Notice –Warning 2nd Notice –Meeting with Parent/Guardian 3rd Notice –Program Dismissal

Please be aware that if your child is here more than 15minutes to 45 minutes after the program ends, the following procedures will be in effect:

- 1. The site coordinator will try to reach the parents/guardians at home or at work.
- 2.If they cannot be reached, the site coordinator will call the emergency numbers on the enrollment form.
- 3.If no authorized person can be reached, the site coordinator will notify the program director and campus police.
- 4. The officer will investigate and try to contact the parent or guardian. If the parent/guardian cannot be reached, the school will contact the Department of Children and Families. If the Department of Children and Families is not able to respond in a timely manner, the local jurisdiction will be contacted.

### Volunteering

If you would like to volunteer in the 21st CCLC program, you must complete a Level 2 background check.

# 21st Century FAQ's

1. What are the program hours?

Dismissal from class to 6:00pm

2. Will the 21st Century Learning Center provide transportation to the program?

We do not provide transportation. Students who enroll in 21st Century iClass Program will need transportation home from their selected school site.

3. Which students are eligible for the program?

Students entering 3rd grade, 4th grade, and 5th grade \*Entering 2nd Grade for students attending Gulfport or High Point

4. Is there a cost for the program?

No

5. Will parents be required to participate?

Yes! Parents are asked to attend engagement night events such as our Franklin Covey 7 Habits of Highly Effective Family Sessions, Webinars, and family nights.

6. What will be the class sizes?

Maximum 20 students per class / 60 students per school site
