### Number of Credits Required for Graduation

- Two Options are available:
  - Traditional 24 credits
  - Accelerated 18 credits
  - BOTH options are also available for Exceptional Students on Access Points
- Both options can be finished in 4 years or earlier (usually 3 years for early graduation)

### Grade Point Average Required for Graduation

- Students must maintain a Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.0 overall
  - This is equivalent to a C grade when ALL grades are average together each year
- Credit Recovery and Grade Forgiveness is available in ALL schools
  - System is called APEX
  - Available: During the day <u>AND</u> after school in Extended Learning Programs (ELP) & Summer

# Specific Courses within 24 credit option (core academics)

- 4 Credits in English Language Arts
  - <u>English 1, 2, 3, and 4</u> which can include Advanced Placement, International Baccalaureate, AICE\*, or Dual Enrollment (SPC) English classes
- 4 Credits in Mathematics
  Which must include <u>Algebra 1</u> and <u>Geometry</u>

\*AICE= Advanced International Certificate of Education

# Specific Courses within 24 credit option (core academics)

#### 3 Credits in Science

- Which must include <u>Biology</u> and 2 other <u>"equally rigorous" science courses</u>
- 3 Credits in Social Studies
  Which must include <u>World History, US</u>
  - History, Economics, and Government

# Specific Courses within 24 credit option (other areas)

- I Credit in Health Options Physical Education
- I Credit in fine arts OR performing arts OR practical arts courses
- 8 Elective Credits

- the State University System admissions process does require 2 of these electives to be 2 years in a World Language
- And ONE course within the 24 credits in the last 2 slides must have been an asynchronous ONLINE course

# Online Course Explained...

- The online course requirement may be met with a course worth a FULL CREDIT or a course worth a HALF CREDIT
- It just must be a complete course
- And it must be ASYNCHRONOUS
  - Which is why all the MY PCS ONLINE classes we ran last year due to COVID do not count as per the State to meet this requirement

### Specific Courses within 18 credit option (Accelerated)

- ALL the CORE classes are required exactly the same as the 24 credit option
- The difference is:
  - 5 Elective Credits required
  - No PE required (so no HOPE class)
  - And No ONLINE Course required

\*AICE= Advanced International Certificate of Education

# **18 Credit Accelerated Option**

- May be completed in 2 years, 3 years, or the full 4 years!!!
- Students wishing to finish early need to ...
  - Start high school ENGLISH and MATH classes while in middle school, OR
  - Double up on ENGLISH and MATH classes in high school during their 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> grade years

#### Finally, State Assessments Requiring a Passing Score for Graduation

- 10<sup>th</sup> grade Florida Standards Assessment (FSA) in English Language Arts and Reading
- Algebra 1 End-of-Course (EOC) Assessment (usually given in the 9<sup>th</sup> or 10<sup>th</sup> grade)
- Students who do not pass either of these tests the first time they take them become Re-Takers

# Pinellas Pathways to Graduation

#### WHAT ARE THE PATHWAYS?

- They are GUIDES for course selection each year for students/parents
- Course selection is the most important factor in college admissions decisions
- These Pathways help you select courses that will best prepare, are best aligned, with your post-high school plans!

# Pinellas Pathways to Graduation

- PCS Pathways are aligned to the State's Diploma Designations:
  - Advanced Scholar Exclusive to PCS!!!
  - College Pathway (Scholar)
  - Technical/College (Merit)
- Designations award students seals for their diplomas (more on this at the end!)
  Diploma Designations

# Advanced Scholar Pathway

- This course of study includes a <u>rigorous level of</u> <u>required and elective courses that best prepare</u> <u>students seeking admittance to **competitive**</u> <u>four-year universities</u> both in and out of state.
  - All students in IB or AICE programs, will qualify for the Advanced Scholar Designation
  - Students in ALL high schools, in any program or academy can pursue this designation!

# College Pathway (Scholar)

This course of study includes a <u>rigorous level of</u> <u>required and elective courses that best prepare</u> <u>students for entry into a college (2 year) or four</u> <u>year university</u> both in and out of state.

### Technical/College (Merit) Pathway

This course of study offers the opportunity for students to <u>challenge themselves in specific</u> <u>academic and elective areas of interest, earn</u> <u>nationally recognized industry certifications,</u> <u>and pursue entry into a post- secondary</u> <u>technical school or state college.</u> Can students move between pathways?

- Yes! 🙂
- There is great flexibility
- These are guides
- Students can start in one and end in a different pathway in 12<sup>th</sup> Grade

# **Diploma Designations**

#### **Diploma Designations**

- There are TESTING requirements for each of the state's 2 Diploma Designations:
  - Scholar and Merit
  - Let's go there!



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#### **Diploma Designations**

Students who earn a high school diploma can also earn diploma seals: a Scholar designation or a Merit designation. Students will also have the opportunity to earn Pinellas County Schools Advanced Scholar designation. Students may earn any or all of these designations, but they are not required to do so.

#### State "Scholar" Designation

In addition to the requirements for a standard diploma, students seeking a state Scholar designation must satisfy specific course and testing
