

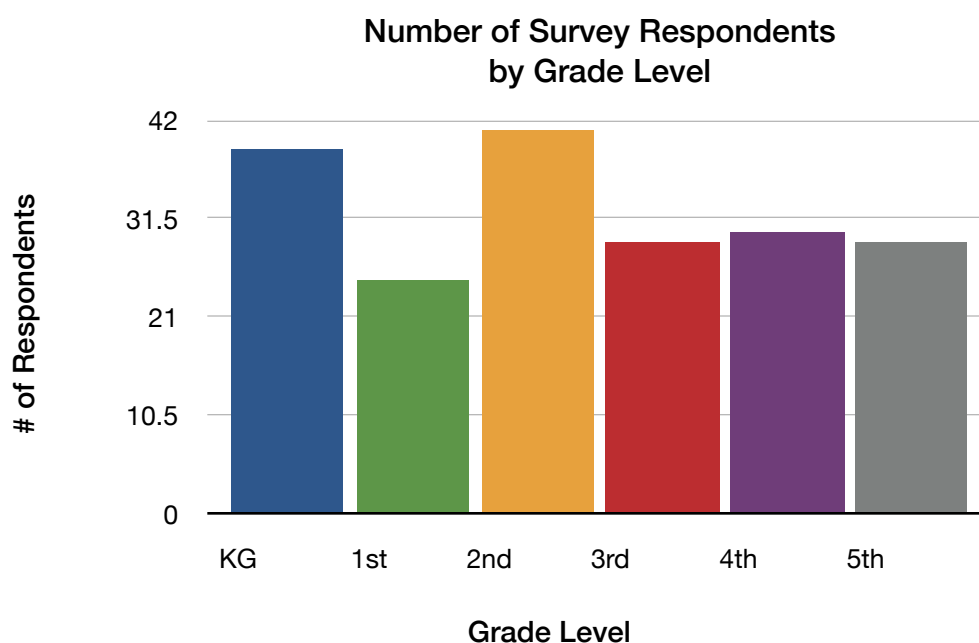
2022 School Climate Survey Results: Addendum

Some sections of the School Climate Survey are general, where parents are asked to reflect on their overall experiences of various facets of the school (i.e. interactions with the front office, communication about school-wide events, campus security, etc.). In other sections, parents are asked to reflect on the specific experiences of their individual students (i.e. modes of communication with the classroom teacher, awareness of grade level and classroom expectations, the number of minutes spent on daily homework, etc.).

This addendum to the main results summary presents the combined data from families that have multiple students enrolled. The corresponding survey item numbers where families answered for multiple students are listed with each prompt.

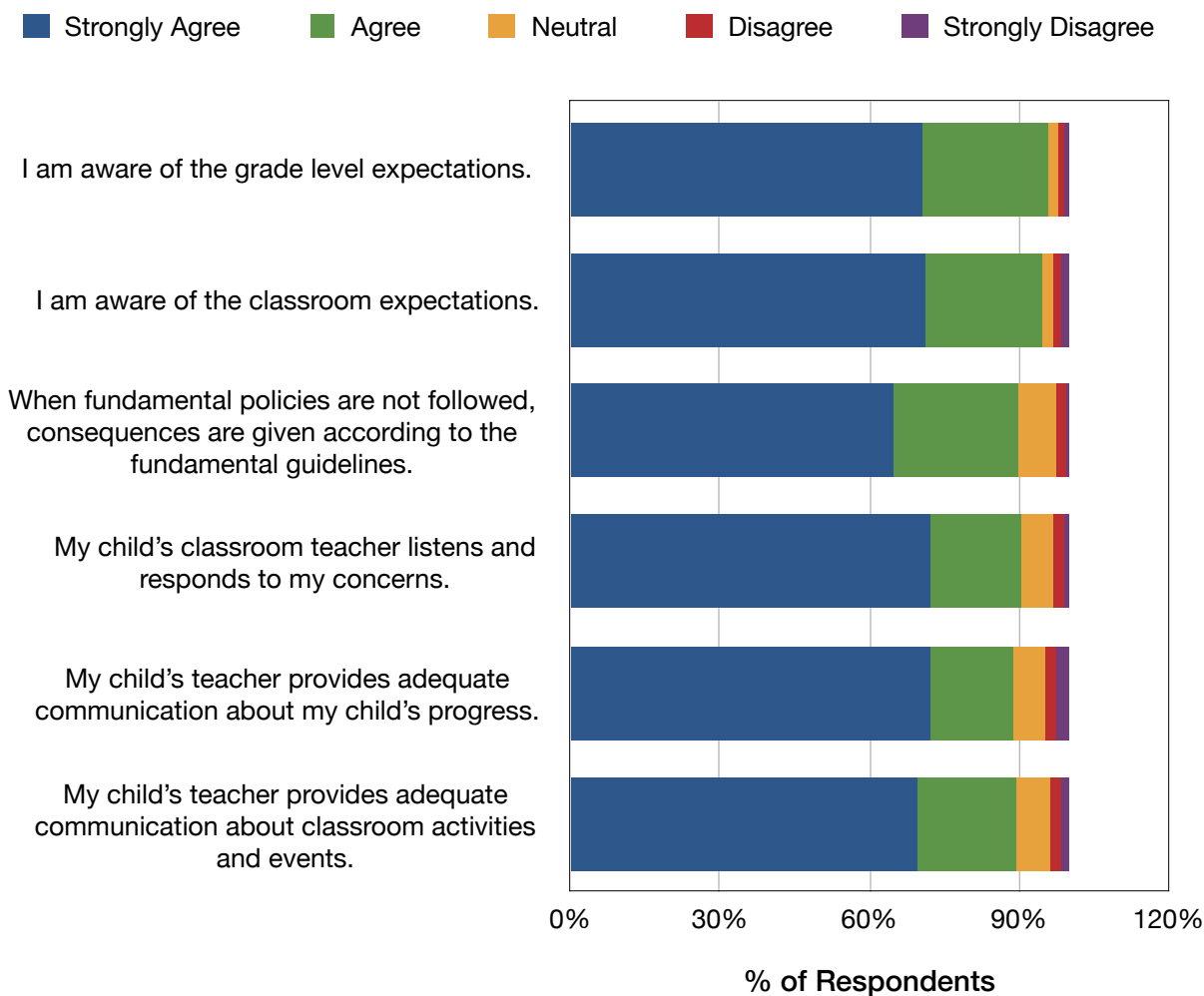
Number of Survey Respondents

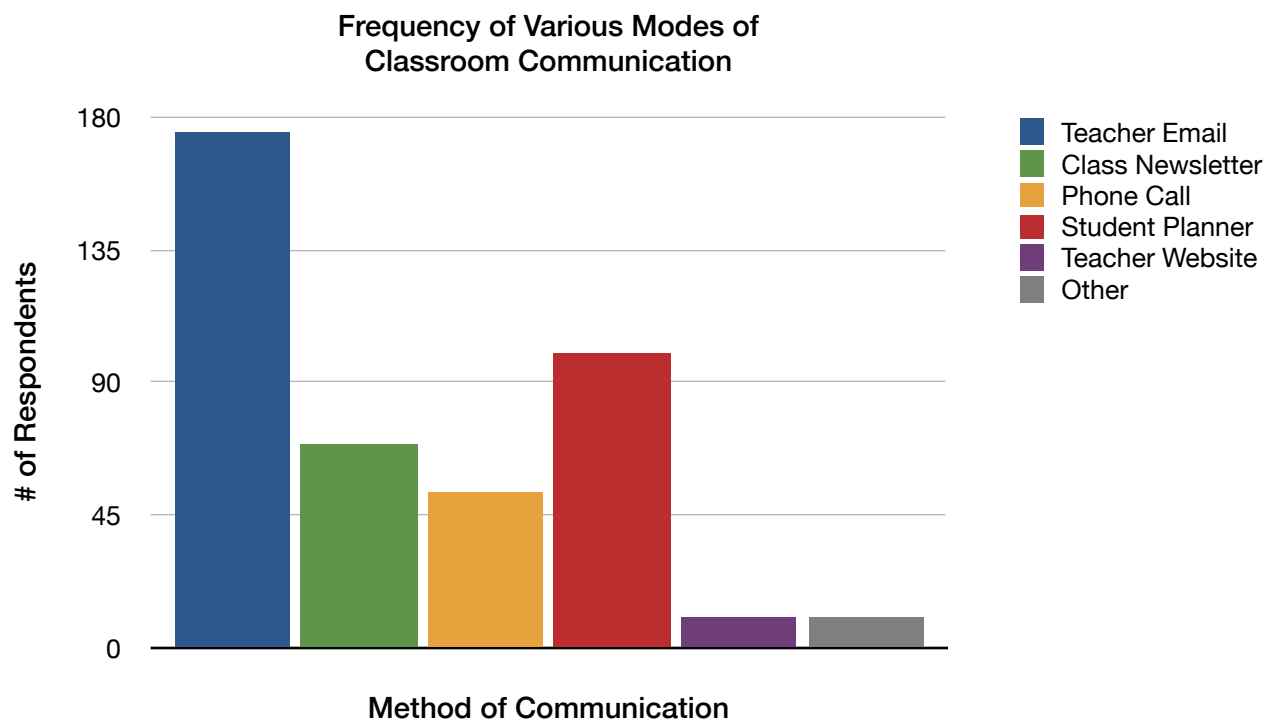
Item 17 & 37: Academic Experiences

Parent Perceptions of Students' Academic Experiences

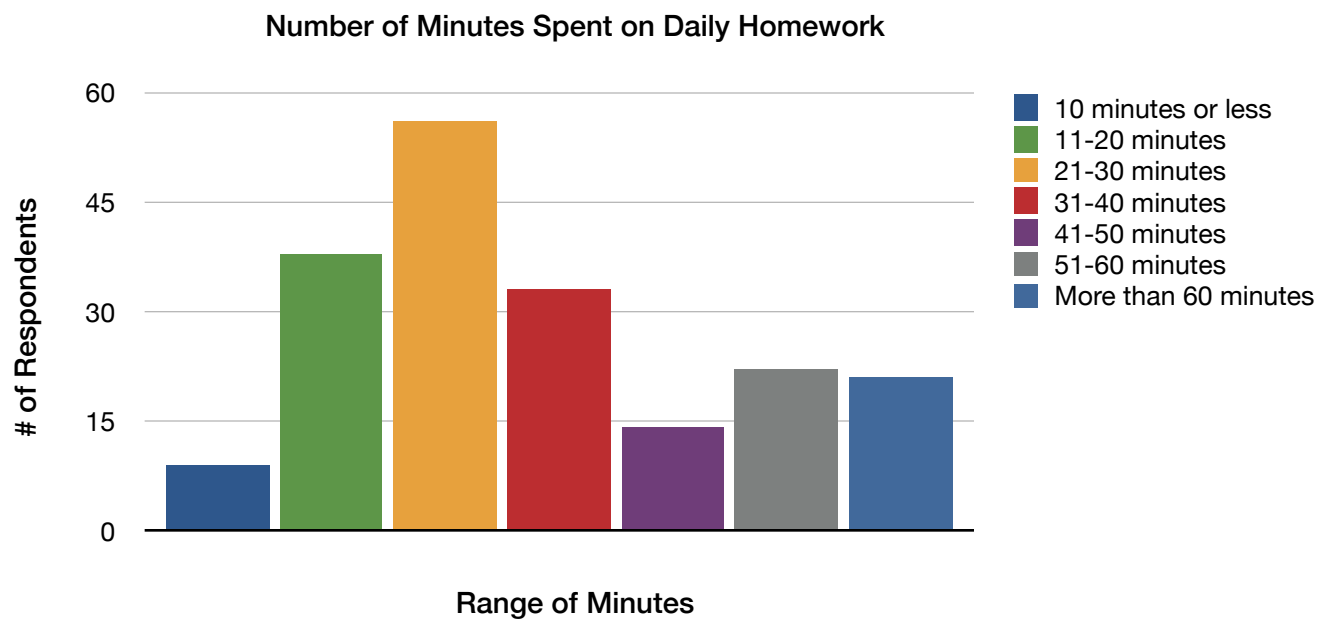
Item 18 & 38: Communication with the Classroom Teacher

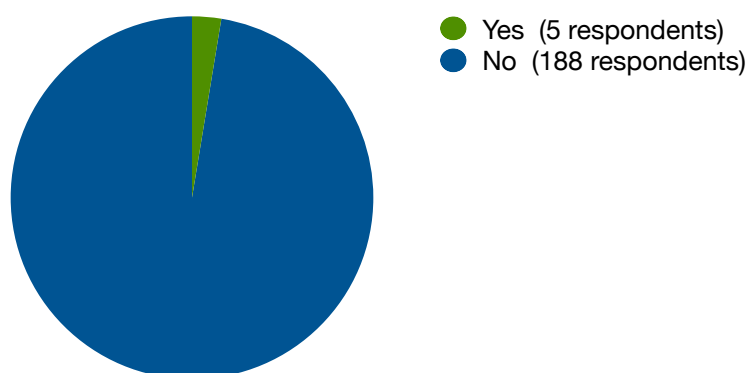
Approximately how many minutes of productive work does it take for your student to complete their daily homework?

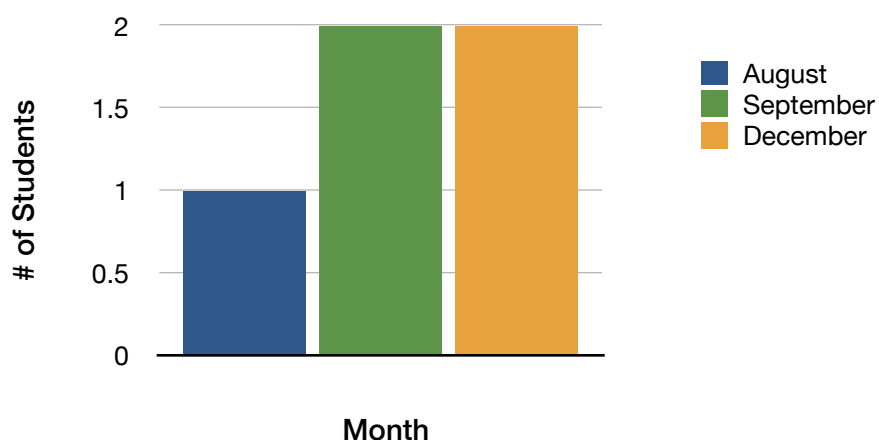
Did your child participate in the district's virtual learning option, Pinellas Virtual School Live!, for any portion of this school year?

**Item 22 & 42: Returning to Campus from PVS Live!**

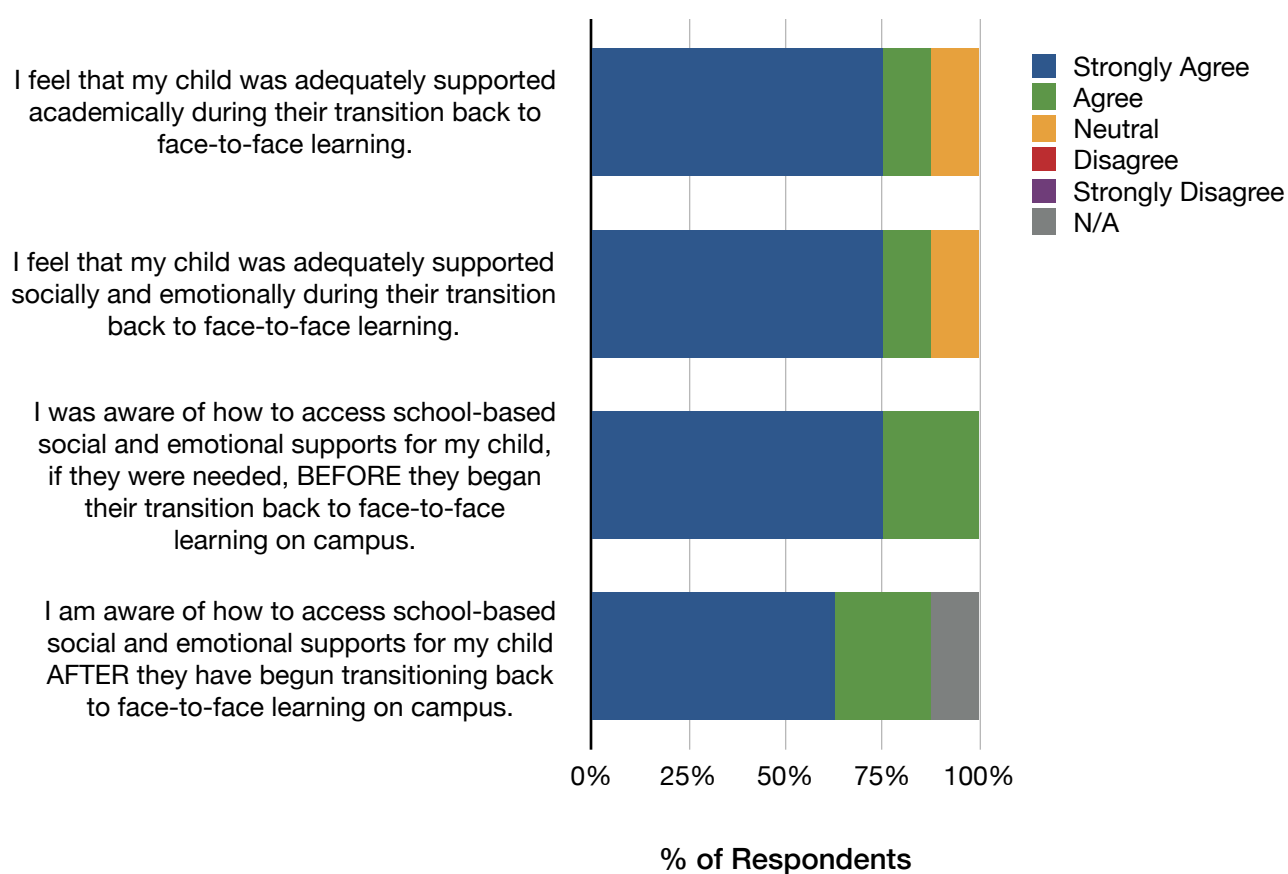
At what point in the year did your student return to face to face learning here at Curtis?
