With March comes the beginning of the testing season. Throughout the month of March students will be taking the third round of ELA, Mathematics and Science MAP Computer Based Assessments. Our students are working hard to do their best each and every day to continue to show improvement. I know that with your support, our students will make gains and show what they know on the

Also, on March 6th, our fourth and fifth grade students will be taking the FSA Writing Assessment. The writing assessment is part of the fourth and fifth grade overall ELA score they will receive when it is combined with the Reading FSA Assessment they will take later on in the year. It is important that all fourth and fifth grade students are present and on time on March 6th. Testing will begin first thing in the morning. The Writing Assessment is a 120 minute test with breaks built in throughout the 120 minutes. I will be sending out School Messenger Messages to all families as a reminder. On that day we will have a silent campus until all students are finished testing. Any fourth or fifth grade student that arrives on campus after testing has begun will not be able to enter their classroom until testing is completed for the day. Students tardy will take the test on a make-up day.



The Song of the Month in March is The National Anthem written by Francis Scott Key in 1814. He was a lawyer and an amateur poet. Eventually his poem was partnered with a tune from England and in 1931 became our National Anthem!

Kindergarten – We are singing simple songs and playing instruments to accompany those songs. We are using body and hand gestures to show pitch.

First Grade – We are taking simple songs and making them more complex by learning how to read the pitches (Mi, Sol and La) and rhythms. Pitched instruments help accompany the songs we are learning and hand gestures help us understand pitch names.

Second Grade – There is a balance of enjoying music and being able to read it. We are understanding that pitches have names and we are trying to see where they live on the staff. Playing to accompany ourselves while singing music has been challenging but fun.

Third Grade – Our focus has been on playing the woodwind instrument called the Recorder. We are trying to read rhythms and notes while covering the right holes in tempo.


Fourth and Fifth Grade – Reading pitch and rhythm has been our focus. We touched on reading key signatures but have been diving into finding Do (pitch) and using the other pitches to figure out how the song sounds. Notating patterns would be an amazing step but we are not completely there yet.

Chorus – Our concert is Tuesday, May 8th at 6p.m. We will probably have our Dress rehearsal that morning.

We have been blessed to have Clearwater Jazz Festival Outreach program share their music with 3rd, 4th and 5th grade. Their concert was February 16th.

Pinellas Community Orchestra came and performed amazing music for the entire school on Friday, February 23rd. We had two of our students perform for the school as well.
