Dear Curtis Fundamental Families,

In the month of December, all students will be assessed on the second round of MAP Assessments. Students will be taking the Mathematics and Reading portion of MAP on the computer. We have been encouraging all of our students to stay focused and to "Show what they know" on the test. Please remind your students, as we do, to take their time, use all the strategies they have been taught and to keep a positive attitude.

Based on district data over the last three years, the second MAP assessment is a good indicator as to how students in third, fourth and fifth grade may perform on the Mathematics and ELA FSA. Once testing is completed, teachers will be sharing your students results with you. The results we receive from this assessment help teachers to differentiate instruction based on individual needs so that students receive instruction in areas that they still need assistance in for Mathematics and ELA.

We will not be having a PTA Meeting or Open Court in the month of December. Our next PTA Meeting will be on Tuesday, January 8, 2019 at 7:00. The focus of the PTA Meeting will be on what will be happening second semester in your child classroom. These discussions will take place either individually in each classroom or grade level. More information will be sent out about specific grade level locations as we get closer to the event.

# Counselor's Corner

### During Classroom Guidance in November, our topic was Gratitude.

**Kindergarten:** We read the book The Giving Tree. The students then did an activity where they drew pictures and wrote about the people they can help by giving them their "gifts".

First Grade: The classes made Bucket Filler Friendship Chains. The students got into pairs and each got a strip of paper. On one side of the paper was the partner's name. One the other side, the students drew and wrote as many positive qualities about the other person that they could think of. The strips were colored and decorated, and then presented in front of the class. Each of the strips was stapled together to make a chain. The chain was a visual representation of the friendships that bind the class together.

**Second Grade:** The students practiced creating "Even If" statements. For example, "Even if it's raining outside, I can still read a book inside until it stops.". The students recognized that they have the power and control to make positive choices for themselves, even in negative situations. There is always something to have gratitude for, in every situation.

Third Grade: We read the book The Bad Seed, and then played the Gratitude Game. Students got into groups and were given a topic. The groups then had to come up with responses as to why they are grateful for that specific thing. For example, storms. They water the earth, end in rainbows, cool off hot days, etc. The goal of the activity was to encourage students to be grateful in unusual circumstances, and to remember that no matter how bad a situation or person seems, there is always good to be found.

Fourth Grade: We read the fable The Lion and the Mouse. The students took a closer look at the lessons of "Even the great need the help of the small" and "Treat others the way you want to be treated". We then had small group and whole group discussion about how the students have experienced this in their own lives.

Fifth Grade: The classes did a restorative circle activity using Gratitude Talking Cards. The students selected cards that they connected to or that reminded them of something they are grateful for in some way. There was time for quiet thinking, then partner turn and talk to communicate the gratitude connection with the image. The students then shared with the whole class what they heard from their classmates about gratitude. The exit task was, be grateful for what you have. Notice what is working and what is right in the world.

Classroom Guidance in December will focus on Career Exploration.

Song of the Month for December is "You're a Grand Old Flag"

**Kindergarten** will be exploring high sounds, low sounds and sounds that stay the same. We are constantly practicing the difference between Pitched instruments and Un-pitched instruments. We will be identifying phrases through chanting, singing, moving, and instrument playing. We also will be learning how to maintain a Steady Beat.

**First grade** will be performing rhythm patterns over the Steady Beat. We will be practicing knowing the difference between Pitched and Un-pitched instruments. We will be identifying quarter notes and rests. We will listen for upward, downward, and repeated pitches.

**Second grade** will be singing, playing and Identifying low Do (pitch). We will explore the half note through movement and identify two tied quarter notes and half rest. We constantly discuss the difference between pitched and un-pitched instruments.

**Third grade** will be reading, writing and performing in 2/4 and 4/4 meter. We will be notating rhythms and bar line placement in ¾ time. We are constantly practicing using the classroom instruments and knowing the difference between pitched and un-pitched instruments.

**Fourth grade** will be identifying sixteenth notes by playing and reading while practicing notes previously learned. We will be reading high C,B,A, and G and low E and D and play them on classroom instruments.

**Fifth grade** will be performing themes and variations. We will be reading high D, C, B, A, G, F#, and F and low E, D, and C and playing them on classroom instruments.

K-2: Striking with your feet 3rd-5th: Invasion games

Speed Cup Demonstration: Danielle Nutter from SpeedStacks.com presented the sport of Sport Stacking. The students were introduced to a pattern called 3-3-3 and were taught to stack and unstack the cups using a left/right hand pattern for speed.
