As we move into the month of October, I am excited about all of the after-school activities we have for our students. We are going to be starting our STEM courses in the coming weeks. Our Mighty Mu teams are working hard. We have begun a new program- Odyssey of the Mind. This is a program geared towards projects focusing on students thinking creatively to solve problems. We will also be starting a new program using an academic program called IReady. This program will be used to support students in the areas of Reading and Mathematics. More information will be coming home soon about our after-school IReady Program.

School Mission

Teachers, students, staff, parents and community are partners in education. We join together to assure a focus on highest student achievement by implementing the Plan/Do/Study/Act cycle. Our goal is for each student to learn and to be successful.

Counselor's Corner

During Classroom Guidance in September, our topic was Respect.

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Kindergarten: We read the book *I Show Respect*, and played a game called Respect Roll and Respond. I rolled a dice, and based on the number, the students discussed with a partner various ways to show respect (to their parents, to their teachers, to their friends, to themselves, and to the world).

First Grade: We did an activity called There Are No Wrong Answers. The students got into groups to discuss their opinions about various topics. They noted how they think alike and how they think different. They also considered what kinds of problems the world would have if everyone thought alike and had the same opinions.

Second Grade: We made dynamic Friendship Venn Diagrams using hula hoops. The students got into pairs and brainstormed all the ways they are the same and all the ways are different.

Third Grade: We did an activity called What is Respect? Students worked in pairs and shared whole-group. Based on different scenarios, the students discussed whether the situation was disrespectful, and to whom it was disrespectful.

Fourth Grade: We did an activity called Be Strong, Be Mean, or Give In? The students learned the response styles of being passive, assertive, and aggressive, to describe the choices they have in conflict situations. They applied these ideas to clarify the choices faced in different situations. They practiced predicting the results, or consequences, of certain choices.

Fifth Grade: The students did role play practicing Showing Respect to Self and Others. They got into groups and created mini-skits based on what showing respect looks like and sounds like. They could use prompts, or create their own situation.

Classroom Guidance in October will focus on Conflict and Bullying.

Treasurer's Report




