Hello Curtis Families! My name is Heidi Jolliffe and I am the "new" School Counselor. I was the School Counselor at Curtis Fundamental from 1996-2004, and then took some time off when my daughter was born. In the years after, I have worked in the field of education in a variety of interesting settings, including doing educational research for Florida State University. I now have the tremendous opportunity to be back at the school I love, with all its wonderful teachers and students. I am thrilled to be here!

I will be going into each classroom one time per month for 30 minutes to do Classroom Guidance. In August, we worked on Relationship Building and did an Introduction to Guidance. During September, we will talk about Conflict and Bullying. In the months ahead, Classroom Guidance topics will include: Respect, Gratitude, Career Exploration, Empathy, Communication and Problem Solving, Mindfulness and Self-Regulation, Healthy Choices, and Growth Mindset.

I also work with students individually and in small groups, as needed. Aside from my role as the School Counselor, I am also the 504 Coordinator.
