School Counselor's Corner

During Classroom Guidance in January, our topic was Empathy.

The students learned that Empathy is the ability to "put yourself in someone else's shoes".

Empathy means understanding how another person feels, because you have had the same feelings. Or, if you haven't had the same experience, you can imagine what it would feel like if you were that person. Empathy means treating others the way you want to be treated.

Kindergarten: We read the book When I Care About Others. The students drew a picture and wrote about the following: "I like it when ______, so I ______." "I don't like it when ______, so I don't _____."

First Grade: The classes reflected, through drawing and writing, on the ways they help others and the ways others help them. They made connections as to how this shows Empathy.

Second Grade: The students created an "Empathy Garden". For example, "squash" dishonesty, "lettuce" be kind, "turnip" to school on time, "peas" in your relationships, and "thyme" to do your school work.

Third Grade: The classes did an activity called "What Does Your Conscience Say?". We discussed that your conscience is an inner voice that tells you what's right and what's wrong. It can make

you stop and consider the consequences when you are about to make a bad choice. Your conscience reminds you when you need to deal with something you've done wrong and try to make things right. The students made connections as to how Empathy can encourage us to make good choices.

Fourth Grade: The students did a role play called "Imagining Yourself in Someone Else's Shoes". They acted out skits demonstrating how they would feel if they were in a person's situation, and what they could do to practice Empathy towards the person in that situation. The students could choose from suggested situations or create their own.

Fifth Grade: The students did role plays about forgiveness. Being empathetic means forgiving. No one is perfect- everyone makes mistakes.

Forgiveness means being able to give someone another chance. Forgiveness is the ability to recognize that, like everyone else, you are capable of making mistakes. It is difficult to forgive others when you cannot see your own faults. The classes practiced asking for forgiveness and showing forgiveness with Empathy in various situations.

Classroom Guidance in February will focus on Communication and Problem Solving.

FOOD COORDINATOR

THE FOOD COORDINATOR OR COORDINATORS (TEAM UP TO SPLIT THE WORK!) MANAGE THE FOOD VENDORS. REACHING OUT TO THE VENDORS, COORDINATING FOR THEIR ARRIVAL AND SET UP. WORKING OUT ANY FEES AND ENSURING THEY ARE SET UP. FOOD COORDINATORS ARE ALSO RESPONSIBLE FOR DRINKS, INCLUDING PICKING UP WATERS, ACQUIRING COOLERS AND PREPARING COOLERS WITH ICE AND BOTTLED WATER FOR THE EVENT.

CLASS BASKETS COORDINATOR

THE CLASS BASKET COORDINATOR POSTS THE CLASS BASKET LIST AND WORKS WITH THE ROOM PARENTS TO PROVIDE GUIDANCE DURING THE COLLECTION AND CREATION OF THEIR CLASS BASKETS. CLASS BASKET COORDINATORS SHOULD BE AVAILABLE THE WEEK OF FFN TO COORDINATE DROP OFF OF THE BASKETS.

T-SHIRTS SPONSORSHIP COORDINATOR

THE T-SHIRT SPONSORSHIP COORDINATOR REACHES OUT TO LOCAL BUSINESSES TO REQUEST ASSISTANCE WITH SPONSORING THE EVENT AND T-SHIRT. PENDING THE DONATION, SPONSORS NAME AND/OR LOGO IS PLACED ON THE BACK OF THE FFN T-SHIRT. THE COORDINATOR WILL SEND FORMS, FOLLOW UP WITH REQUESTS AND ENSURE ALL LOGOS ARE COLLECTED FOR T-SHIRT PRINTING.

GAMES COORDINATOR

THE GAMES COORDINATOR WORKS WITH VENDORS TO BRING IN GAMES AND ACTIVITIES FOR FFN. THEY ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR ACQUIRING THE CONTRACTS (TO BE APPROVED BY THE PTA BOARD), ACQUIRING NECESSARY FORMS OF INSURANCE AND BEING PRESENT THE NIGHT OF THE EVENT TO GREET THE VENDORS AND ASSIST WITH SETUP
