We also know that our school goals cannot be obtained without all of us working together and striving to be our best. As spring activities pick up, make sure to set aside time to have your children read books that they enjoy and practice some math concepts in the car while you rush from one place. Here are a few ideas your child can play in the car to pass travel time and keep math fresh in their brains.

The Counting Game - Keep a running count of different objects you see (red cars, telephone poles, street signs)

License Plate Math - Practice adding, subtracting, and/or multiplying numbers on license plates you can spot from the car

Gas Mileage - For older students the next time you fill up ask your child to help calculate gas mileage or how far you can drive until you need to get gas again

Trip budgeting - Ask your child to help plan the day's budget

and figure out how much you need as you stop for

food, gas, and snacks

Estimation Station - Estimate how far you are away from the next

stop light, store, destination (how many feet, or how

many car lengths)

May your days off for spring break be restful and rejuvenating as we gear up for our final quarter of the school year. This is a time filled with so much learning as we make our final push to finish the year strong. As long as your child is healthy, please focus on getting your child to school on time each day. Every day of school is an important opportunity for students to learn as well as connect to peers and their teachers.

We Pledge to be Upstanders that Say Something!

It can be hard for adults to know how the children in their lives are feeling. Today, many children and teens turn to online channels to express themselves, their thoughts and hopes, and their anxieties and personal feelings. Some even go as far as hinting they want to hurt themselves or someone else.

Their friends and peers are the eyes and ears of a school community and may observe these communications but not always understand or know what to do with that information. *Say Something* teaches all of this.

We encourage you to talk to your child about how important it is to *Say Something* and encourage them to share what they are learning. Not only will this conversation help you to recognize any signs in your own student's expressions, but it also demonstrates to them that you take this subject seriously and can be one of the trusted adults they turn to if they suspect someone may need help. We know that schools are meant to be safe places.

Say Something will help equip our young people to do their part to keep our school community safe.

March Skill - Positive Intent

The related power for this skill is the Power of Love.

BIG IDEA: Choose to see the best in others.

GOAL: Seeing the best in others keeps us in the higher centers of our brain so we can consciously respond instead of unconsciously react to life events.

Positive intent is always our first step. We must see children differently in order for them to behave differently. Once we can see the behavior as a call for help, we are able to identify the missing skill behind the behavior and A.C.T. to teach that missing skill.

Acknowledge the child's desire. Use the phrase "You wanted_____."

Clarify the skill to use. "When you want_____, say (or do)____."

Take time to practice. "Do it now for practice." or "Let's do it together for practice. Example –

Sally bites Billy. "Sally you wanted Billy to back up, so you bit him, biting hurts. You may not bite. When you want Billy to back up say, "Please back up, Billy."
