SCHOOL CLINIC CORNER

IMPORTANT END OF SCHOOL YEAR INFORMATION!

Pinellas County Schools policy does not allow us to send medication home with students or store it over the summer.

Please arrange to come to school to pick up any unused medication, including inhalers and Epinephrine Devices.

Any unclaimed medications will be disposed of on Thursday, May 26th, 2022 at 12:00 noon without exception.

Please note that your child will be sent home if they experience ONE or more of the following:

- Fever over 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit
- One episode of diarrhea or vomiting
- Dry cough, or shortness of breath (not due to asthma)

Allergies seem to be troubling our scholars this year. Please pay attention to allergy symptoms (stuffy, runny noses and headaches) and discuss with them with your child's pediatrician. Please note that allergies do not cause fever. Also, remember that scholars are not allowed to bring medications, even eye drops, to school. All inhalers and other medications must be registered with the School Nurse and stored in the Clinic.

Could your student benefit from extra learning opportunities over the summer?

Registration for <u>Summer Bridge</u> is open, and is especially important for students who are not performing on grade level or need additional help to stay on track. Summer Bridge is free and provides engaging activities and focused instruction to prepare students for maximum success.

Most programs will run Monday through Thursday from June 6th - June 30, 8:00am - 2:00pm. Jamerson will be a Summer Bridge site this year.

Note: Register by May 1st to receive transportation starting the first day of Summer Bridge. Please request transportation when submitting your application. Transportation is available only to students who live 2-4 miles from Jamerson. Students who live within 2 miles of Jamerson are not eligible for transportation. Students who live more than 4 miles from Jamerson will receive transportation, and attend, Summer Bridge at their ZONED school.

Families can provide their own transportation and still attend Summer Bridge at Jamerson.

TEST TAKING TIPS

BEFORE:

- 1. Get a good night's sleep the night before and think about pleasant things as you drift to sleep.
- 2. Eat a healthy breakfast.
- 3. Arrive at school with plenty of time to get to your classroom without having to rush to be on time.
- 4. THINK POSITIVELY. You've worked hard in class and this is a chance for you to "show what you know."
- 5. Don't worry if you feel a little nervous because that's natural.

DURING

- 6. Listen very carefully to the directions for taking the test.
- 7. Stay focused on what you are reading. If your mind wanders, go back and reread the section
- 8. For reading, remember to look back at the passage as often as you like to find an answer.
- Read each question carefully. Make sure you understand what it is asking. Eliminate any extra information you don't need to answer the question.
- 10. Read all answer choices carefully. Try to eliminate 2 answer choices right away, if you can. That way you can concentrate on the other 2 answer choices. Two answer choices may be similar, but one of them will be the BETTER choice.
- 11. If you get to a passage that seems hard or long or boring, don't give up. Give it your best try.
- 12. After you have finished the test, if you have time left, be sure to check your answers carefully.
- 13. Make sure you have not skipped any questions.
- 14. Make sure that you only have one answer for each question.
- 15. Pat yourself on the back! You did your very best. Be proud of your effort.
