Chief Reeves was born in Orlando, FL and was raised in Melbourne, FL. She joined the United States Navy March 3, 1999 and attended basic training at Recruit Training Command, Great Lakes, IL.

Upon graduating from Recruit Training, Chief Reeves attended Information System Technical "A" School in Great Lakes, IL.

In September 1999, Chief Reeves reported for duty to Naval Computer and Telecommunications Area Master Station LANT in Norfolk, VA where she served as a fleet center operator and was advanced to Information System Technician Third Class.

In October 2001, Chief Reeves reported to USS Dwight D. Eisenhower CVN-69 in Norfolk, VA. Shortly after reporting, she was advanced to Information System Technician Second Class and assigned as the Watch Center Supervisor, where she was directly responsible for all facets of radio operations.

In February 2006, Chief Reeves was selected for special duty recruiting and transferred to Navy Recruiting District Atlanta and recruited at Navy Recruiting Station Panama City, FL. During this tour Chief Reeves was Meritoriously promoted to Information System Technician First Class and cross rated to become a career recruiter.

In October 2009, Chief Reeves attended the Career Recruiting Force Academy and transferred to NRD Richmond. During this tour she led recruiting station Alexandria, VA as well as Medical Officer Recruiting Springfield, VA. Chief Reeves was promoted to the rank of Chief Petty Officer September 2012

In December 2012, Chief Reeves reported to NRD San Antonio as a Division Leading Chief and led, managed and developed the sailors of Division Three, which consisted of Navy Recruiting Stations, Copperas Cove, Killeen, Temple and Waco, TX., Navy Reserve Station Waco, TX and Navy Officer Recruiting Station Waco, TX.

In December 2015, Chief Reeves reported to Commander Navy Recruiting Command Headquarters in Millington, TN. During this tour she managed the Medical Service Corps Active Reserve and Student programs and Medical Corps Student Programs.

On 30 April 2019, Chief Reeves retired from the United States Navy with 20 years of Honorable Naval Service. Chief Reeves holds a Bachelor of Science in Business Management from Post University and a Master of Art in Human Resource Management from Webster University.

Chief Reeves personal awards include the Navy, Marine Corps Commendation Medal (2 Gold star's), and the Navy, Marine Corps Achievement Medal (3 Gold star's).
