Principal's Report:

School Wide Focus: Evidence of rigorous planning to include AVID strategies with a daily focus on literacy and collaboration in the classroom.

ACADEMIC

Teaching vs. Learning - We teach, but are the students learning? EL/ESE/IEP/Interventions

- Everyday students should be:
- Reading in all classes – having their eyes on texts
- Answering rigorous high-level questions and discussing
- Writing about what they read
- Cycle 2 Testing – we are about where we were last year – increasing push-in supports for core content areas
- PBIS – rewarding attendance for students and teachers
 - Could benefit from additional incentives – currently giving shirts/gear
- Currently speaking with all students about the benefits of advanced coursework and supports that we offer (AVID, ELP) and reviewing course requests for next year. Working on stamina

ATHLETIC/CLUBS

- Academic Team is 1st place in the district – our coach has been chosen to lead the team to the state competition
- Spring sports starting

OTHER

- Student Support Night February 5th – 12 families participated, mainly senior at-risk students
 - All 9th grade students/families
 - All ELL students/families
 - 10th and 11th grade students based on GPA to discuss advance coursework
 - At-risk 12th grade students to discuss plan of action, testing dates, etc.
- FAFSA Night – February 11th, 6 pm
- Personnel – All instructional positions are currently filled – 2 long-term subs in math and ELA, College Career Counselor interviews took place last week
