Principal's report a/k/a State of the Royal Court Report:

- **More and more students are coming into Hollins unprepared for High School which presents challenges to get all students where they need to be.**
- **Hollins named an AVID school of distinction.**
- **Continued schoolwide focus on literacy. Less than 50% of the students are proficient in reading means that the school needs to focus on additional ways to improve literacy and will begin infusing literacy components into electives. Students who used to read short amounts of texts are not spending a lot of time watching videos/ reels. Testing requires a significant amount of focus on reading long sections of text and students are not used to it. Need everyone's support in encouraging students to read every day.**
- **School census grew the most in the southern part of the county with exponential growth. This included the addition of 11 teachers. Between the added classes and the hiring that was needed to maintain the classes we had meant 23 teachers were hired in total.**

### New Business: Funding requests

- **AVID for college tours (\$500 transportation)** – Ms. August will look into Pinellas Education Foundation grant opportunities and possibly need to come back to this group in Oct/ Nov with the same request (if no grants are awarded).
