### School Improvement 2019 - 20

Discussion of board updates: Dr. Greco's role and his focus on 3-5 year goals as opposed to year over year goals (effective, well-respected, working). The yearly goals should speak for themselves at year's end.

- Overall county updates: graduation rates evaluated with a focus on Hispanic communities
- AP stats mirrors grad rates; "journey statistic"
- College & Career planning centers going forward: designated places where the prep courses become a little more accessible and familiar to families. Designed to be an effective conduit for students and families as they prepare for college & beyond.

#### School processes and resources

- Ident-a-kid: Mandatory identification, gov't issued IDs. Discussion as to what constitutes approved ID; foreign ID or passport are valid. What this process generally accounts for is accountability for all individuals on campus and records the purpose of their visit: where you're going, what you're doing, etc. ....Level 2 volunteers still need to scan their ID even if they have their badge.
- Student/parent resources discussed: Ask the eCounselor where you can ask a general question and quickly receive an answer online
