## Greetings Lynch Families,

Thanks for partnering with us this year, we look forward to great things happening in 2018.

We continue to welcome you to visit our school. There are many opportunities available during the school day to fit your schedules. Having parents take an active role in their child's education is vital to success. Please contact our volunteer liaison, Cheryl Hanneman to find out how you can take part at Lynch Elementary School...as we welcome each of you!

There are a few things I would like to share with you regarding our day to day operations at Lynch Elementary. We want to be a family friendly school and also ensure the safety and well-being of all students, staff, and parents. You may help by doing the following:

Please have your child to school by 8:35 a.m. The front gate closes at 8:35 a.m. and students arriving after the designated arrival time are considered tardy and will need a pass to class from the front office.



Breakfast is served from 8:05-8:25 a.m. Students arriving after 8:25 a.m., will report directly to class. The exception will be bus students who arrive late.

All kindergartener students report to the cafeteria each morning and are escorted to class by their classroom teacher...even the students who do not eat breakfast.

Lynch is a closed campus during the school day. To be on campus you must present a valid driver's license or a state ID and receive a visitor's badge from the front office.

Please arrive in a timely manner for afternoon dismissal. Dismissal is at 2:35 p.m. and staff is on duty until 3:05 p.m.

Arriving to school before 8:00 a.m. offers no supervision by school staff. Some students are arriving as early as 7:00 a.m. Please check at the YMCA, Fossil Park, or Roberts for early morning care.

As you drop off your children in the AM please remind them to be seated and wait until the front gate opens at 8:05 a.m. Many students are running around and leaving campus...this a safety issue. Students who continually do not follow the rules will not be allowed to arrive before 8:05 AM.

We are a uniform school. If you are not sure about the uniform color or types of clothing please see front office staff.

Last...very important....the bus circle...many parents are parking in the STAFF PARKING lot which is connected to the bus circle...I have closed this off before but would like to extend a courteous offer by leaving it open, BUT...students are summoned across the bus drive to you standing by your car in the parking lot...although I have placed a staff member on duty there, this pulls them away from the actual crosswalk, and I'm very concerned about students looking at you and not the busses. I will have someone visit from transportation to give me feedback on a safer way....If you are parking in that lot for now, please park, walk across to collect your child and then walk them back. Please don't summon them over. If you can't leave your car because of little ones, then please go through the car circle...it's much safer and faster at this point of the year.
