## **STEP 1: Choose Your Book**

## **STEP 2: Read and Annotate**

As you read, choose 25 passages or quotations that stand out to you (make sure your entries come from the beginning, middle, and end of the book). You may identify these passages or quotations by highlighting, underlining or placing post-it notes in your book.

## **STEP 3: Create and Complete a Dialectical Journal**

- Record the chosen passages/quotations in the <u>left-hand column</u> of a T-chart.
- Include chapter and page numbers of print or electronic text AFTER the passages/quotations (ALWAYS).
- Write a response to each of the passages/quotations you chose (your ideas/insights, questions, reflections, comments) *in the right-hand column*.

Typing the Dialectical Journal is best, though you may use notebook paper. Again, you need 25 entries. See the example Dialectical Journal entry below:
