### First IB Class Gauges Success

ST. PETERSBURG — The students came from all over Pinellas County, some enduring hot bus rides to a school far from home. At first, they barely knew what to call themselves. All they knew was that they were in for a challenge.

St. Petersburg High was the first public school in Florida with an International Baccalaureate program. On Monday night, the school invited alumni from the first-ever IB class, 30 years after they tossed their caps, to return and see how the program had grown.

When it was introduced in 1983, few people in the state had heard of an IB diploma, said Dr. Ralph Cline, 68, who was one of the program's first teachers at St. Petersburg High. Unlike Advanced Placement courses, IB programs offer a fixed curriculum, where all students take the same rigorous classes throughout high school in all subjects. At the end of their senior year, they undergo intense testing for college credit.

That initial group of students didn't know what they were getting into, said DJ Wagner, 47, valedictorian of the first IB class.

"I remember joking that we were guinea pigs," Wagner said. "We were all figuring it out together."

The uncertainty made it feel like an adventure, said Dana Andersen, 47, another student from the original class. At the time, St. Petersburg High was a tight-knit, neighborhood school, she said, and the IB students all felt like the new kids.

"I remember having to explain what we were doing to other kids a lot," Andersen said. "I always told people we were like a school within a school."



Teachers met every day after school to talk through their methods, exploring successes and failures and counseling their students, said Cline, who taught IB history at St. Petersburg High and later worked for IB's governing body in New York City. Now he's executive director of the Florida League of IB Schools.

When he started teaching IB, he said, there was little training. Instead, teachers designed the curriculum themselves through what they jokingly called "backwash" — studying past exams and trying to build curriculum that would adequately prepare their students. But they weren't just teaching to the test, Cline said. They were teaching students how to think deeply, through an emphasis on writing and critical thinking skills across all academic disciplines.

Cline remembers times it felt like they were "failing spectacularly," where he'd assign an extended essay and get back messy, muddled papers. But dedication was extreme on both sides, he said, and by the time the students took their final tests, they excelled.

"The fact that they tried so hard and did so well is really a credit to them," Cline said. "Nobody was intellectually braver than these guys."

Monday evening, 19 students from the Class of 1987 and four of the original teachers gathered at the Coliseum, along with hundreds of families, students and faculty to witness this year's IB commencement ceremony.

The school wanted the alumni to see how the program had developed, said IB coordinator and assistant principal Susan Farias. But they also want to honor their



boldness, and allow the younger students to understand the program's roots.

"What I'm hoping is that they see that these first students were risk-takers and pioneers," she said.

Nearly 3,200 students have graduated from St. Petersburg High's IB program since 1987. Farias said.

"The IB program is for the student who's not afraid to work hard," she said. "By the end, they've learned how to learn."

During the ceremony, alumni from the first IB class sat in front, beneath the Coliseum's arched ceilings. While friends, families and the 111 graduating seniors ate dinner and snapped photos, the Class of 1987 shook hands and crammed chairs around the table, determined to stick together. When Ryan Halstead, a history teacher and former IB student, introduced them as "trailblazers," they grinned and giggled.

"Like many of you," Halstead told the new graduates, "they learned how to defend why someone would choose hard work over plain old fun."

They were called to the stage just like the 2017 graduates, their accomplishments listed off for the audience — master's degrees, Ph.Ds, businesses and children of their own. Farias stuck IB induction pins on their shirts and draped white IB graduation sashes over their shoulders.

After that, the Class of 1987 sat whispering at its table. Much like the students around them, they took selfies and swapped stories, joking about all the ways they'd changed and all the ways they hadn't.

## **Parent Communications Survey Results**

This Spring, the IB Booster Membership and IB Advocate committees, with help from the Booster Board and parent volunteer Joe O'Connor, surveyed the IB parent Google group about communications preferences. Thank you to the parents who responded.

Here's a summary of the results that are relevant to changes to The Advocate.

There were 56 respondents. Nearly everyone who participated said that they actively read The Advocate, find most aspects of The Advocate useful, and want information more frequently.

The Advocate is published three times per year and most survey respondents want information at least monthly. When asked how an electronic-only Advocate would affect their level of readership, 74% said they would have the same or higher likelihood of reading it. 27% said they would read it less. However, of those who said they would read it less, every person but one said they want information more frequently than now, and most of them want it at least monthly.

Virtually everyone would be fine with receiving notifications of updates via email or Facebook. Parents also provided ideas for additional topics to be covered.

#### Why we are switching to a digital Advocate

Clearly, people want information more frequently than what they receive now. This matches the survey results that the information content most valued is calendar and news-based information.

We can infer that if the Advocate remained <u>print-based</u>, everyone would continue their level readership. Meanwhile, almost

unanimously everyone (98%) wants information **more frequently**, and the vast majority (87%) want it **at least monthly**.

However, moving to a <u>monthly</u> print-based Advocate is impractical and probably impossible without a lot more resources.

Will there be a negative impact of going electronic? Whereas 27% said they would read an electronic Advocate less, \*\*everyone\*\* wanted information \*\*more frequently\*\*, and \*\*most\*\* wanted it at least monthly.

Therefore, it is reasonable to imagine that a more frequent electronic Advocate may offset their inclination to read it less than a printed Advocate.
