In keeping with the pride and tradition of service to their community, in June 1988, a number of cavalry descendants and African Americans with prior military service assembled to form a Buffalo Soldier chapter in Tampa, Florida. Under the direction of Israel Tilman, John H. Padgett, and Charles Vann, the chapter constitution and bylaws were written. After the membership reached adequate levels for chapter petition, organizational documents were submitted to the National Headquarters-Ninth & Tenth Horse Cavalry Association. The Woods & Wanton group was awarded its chapter status on August 2, 1997 at the 131st national reunion, United States Military Academy-West Point, New York. The chapter's affiliation with the Ninth & Tenth Horse Cavalry, established Tampa as the only national association chapter in the state of Florida.

The Following year, in July 1998 at the national association's 132nd reunion in Baltimore, Maryland, the Woods & Wanton Chapter received special commendation for its community involvement and historical colloquiums. The chapter's mission is to perpetuate the memory of comrades who have passed on and the history of the many accomplishments of the Buffalo Soldiers regiments in the defense of this country. The chapter provides high quality activities to prepare local youth to contribute and take leadership roles in society. Our mentoring, scholarships and community service activities link history and practice to benefit the community.

The chapter is named after Congressional Medal of Honor recipients, Sergeant Brent Woods, Troop B - 9th Cavalry/Indian Wars 1881 and Private George W. Wanton, Troop M - 10th Cavalry/Spanish American War.

Scholarship applicants must be a graduating high school senior or first year college student. Applications are not renewable. Applicants must be residents of the Tampa Bay Area. The application deadline is March 1st. Scholarships will be awarded based on academic achievement, financial need and community service. Each submittal will be reviewed and rated by the scholarship committee.
