- Principal: L. Fatolitis
 - Vision and Mission were provided. Data points and school grade performance was explained-10 cells were totaled and the school grade for 2018-2019 was a B. Sub-group data was shared. That information will be part of the SIP. Growth has been noted and we continue to move in a positive direction.
 - Bridging the GAP (BTG)-we are making progress and continue to work in this area.
 - Code of Student Conduct-this information will be shared with parents via Principal email communication
 - New School Personnel- Science, Library/Media, Reading/Football Coach, Business.
 - The Veterinary Science Program will be receiving an award.
 - 90% of students are enrolled in a pathway program, which yields honors credit, college credit, or industry certification.
 - Now have FB, Twitter, website, and weekly email communications. We encourage people to add positive comments on social media.
 - Culinary building is deemed safe.
 - Question was asked about signage for the car line. That is in the process of being ordered.
 - Question about the crosswalk signage/indicators and whether an L-Shaped sign could hang over the street. That is a county decision.
 - 1352 is current enrollment, up from last year. We hope to remain stable after the 10 day count.
 - Dress code remains the same, which follows the county dress code.

- Site Safety assessment was done over the summer.
- New system-ERIP-electronic format for crisis plans. One active threat drill per month.
- "Stop the Bleed" class is being considered for staff members-teaches triage type care in case of an active threat.
- Discussed identifying staff members in each building that have certain skill sets or ability to handle crisis situations.
- No bag policy still in place for athletic events.
- Quests attending luncheon activities at the Culinary building are run through badge pass.
