

## Pathways for Acceleration - AVID

### **ADVANCEMENT VIA INDIVIDUAL DETERMINATION (AVID)**

AVID is a college preparatory program designed for students with academic potential who are eager to pursue additional honors and AP coursework.

To learn more about the many benefits AVID offers, attend the informational session in the media center.

## Pathways for Acceleration – AP

### **ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP)**

These are college-level courses where students will earn high school credit and potentially college credit as well. In May, students will take the AP Exam. Those who score a 3, 4, or 5 (on a 1-5 point scale) will receive college credit at most universities. In Florida, all universities accept a score of 3 for college credit.

<u>AP Human Geography</u>: This course explores human settlements, cultural diversity (pop culture, languages, religions, ethnicities), global development (developed vs. developing countries, careers), and cities worldwide, focusing on overcrowding and cultural influences like food and restaurants.


AP Government (paired with Government Honors): APGOPO provides a college-level introduction to key political concepts, institutions, policies, and behaviors in the U.S. constitutional system and political culture, offering one semester of College Political Science (3+ on the AP Exam) and counting as a Government or elective credit for the second semester.

<u>AP Computer Science Principles</u>: AP Computer Science introduces students to foundational concepts in computer science and their impact on the world. Key topics include creative development, data, algorithms and programming, computer systems and networks, and the broader impact of computing.
