2020-2021 Early Admission (EA) Program Checklist

1. Complete an SPC student application online at www.spcollege.edu to receive a student ID number.
 - Click *APPLY TO SPC button*.
 - Select “High School Programs Student” and follow the step-by-step procedures. (The \$40 application fee will be waived for dual enrollment students once they are enrolled by the DE office.) You **MUST** know your Pinellas County School ID and Social Security numbers to complete the application. **Accuracy of your SS# and Date of Birth are important as these are used in the log in process.**

Note: Skip this step if you already have an SPC ID number. If you attended College for Kids, you have a number. If you are unsure if you already have an SPC ID number, please contact an SPC dual enrollment office.

2. Take the College Placement Test (PERT).
 - RECOMMENDED TESTING OPTIONS (Outside of the school day):
 - Pre-register for the College Placement Test/PERT at web.spcollege.edu/survey/29128. Test dates and locations will be available at this website.
 - **Testing is available on a limited basis at the SPC campus testing centers.** Be sure to bring your SPC ID number, photo ID and pink card to the testing center.

If you plan to use your SAT or ACT scores in lieu of PERT scores for eligibility, please go to a campus testing center with a photo ID and log in to your College Board or ACT Student account to get your scores into our system

3. Request an unofficial transcript from your current high school once first semester grades (fall term of junior year) have posted.

4. **Early Admission Applicants** (rising seniors) - See your PCS school counselor to verify eligibility for the Early Admission Program. If eligible, your school counselor will refer you to the 2020-2021 APPLICATION FOR EARLY ADMISSION TO COLLEGE within the PCS Student Reservation System. **APPLICATION DOES NOT GUARANTEE ACCEPTANCE INTO THE EARLY ADMISSION PROGRAM.**
5. The application must be completed and all admission eligibility criteria met by **11:59 p.m. on Monday, February 10, 2020.**
6. **Applicant Selection** – Enrollment in EA is capped at 40 students per campus. If the number of new applications received exceeds the number of available openings, students will be selected through a random lottery system. The computer-generated lottery (conducted in February after all applications are received and verified) will create a list of students who will be invited to attend EA as well as a numbered waitlist.
7. Acceptance/notification emails will be sent no later than **Friday, February 14, 2020.**
8. For those selected to the program, a commitment to accept/decline the Early Admission Program must be **RECEIVED by 2 p.m. on Wednesday, February 19, 2020.**

Before an out-of-district student can apply for the Early Admission program, a Pinellas County Schools Special Attendance Permit must be approved. Students with Special Attendance Permits will be considered for seats remaining after all PCS applicants have been placed. Contact the PCS Student Assignment office at 727-588-6210.
