AP Research Summer Assignment

All assignments are due on the first day of AP Research class. Please bring a paper copy of your assignment and have an electronic copy accessible on your OneDrive account through PCSB.

This assignment will orient you to the nature and responsibilities of research and provide opportunities to explore your research topic. Type all responses for #s 1, 2, 4, 5, 6 in Times New Roman, Size 12. Scan and embed #3 in your document if you create it by hand. If you type the flow chart for #3 or create another visual, ensure it is properly placed in your assignment prior to submission.
