Students will be held responsible for the assignments on the first day of the fall semester. If a student chooses to change the level of course or class or program over the summer, the student will be held responsible for the summer assignments for the courses reflected on the schedule for the first day of school.

- Assignment: Double-Entry Journal: students choose <u>ONE</u> of the following questions to answer for <u>EACH</u> chapter. You must use ALL six questions.
 - *What are 5 new vocabulary words you learned from this chapter? Write the definition and use each word in a sentence.
 - *What is an event or person you identify with and why?
 - *What is a prediction about what might happen next? Explain with quotes from the text.
 - *How did this chapter, the story, or these people make you feel?
 - *Is there anything that you've experienced or seen in your life or as a part of our society that connects to the events in this chapter?
 - *How is an event or conflict in this chapter completely different from your life?

Divide the paper in half. Label the left side "question" and the right side "My response". Use quotations and "textual evidence," but focus on your response and ideas. **Respond to one question for each chapter.** At some point you must use ALL 6 questions.
