Essay Assignment

Write a detailed character analysis about the protagonist from your novel. Essays should be original, typed, 500 words, 5 paragraph style. Do not summarize the plot. Please include:

- -introduction and conclusion paragraphs
- -characterization methods used by the author to develop the main character

(description, actions, effect/reaction, dialogue, analysis, stream of conscience)

- -conflict, climax, and solution to conflict (how main character solved his conflict/problem)
- -universal themes and archetypes, and how these influenced the development of the main character and the conflict
