Joni Jonas – Pinellas County Director of Secondary Career Technical Education, oversees all middle and high school CTE programs. (Background info: Ford Motor Co realized labor force not up to par, they determined high schools were not producing the level they need so they developed the career academy model through their foundation. When academies are implemented with fidelity they noticed less absent, higher grades, students more motivated to go on to college.) Florida implemented career academies state wide through legislation for 1 CAPE academy in every district. Pinellas County came up with Centers of Excellence in every high school. 5 year plan implemented, with the 2nd five year plan now in the works. Goal has been for 35% of high school seniors to graduate with a certification in an industry profession, which Pinellas has achieved in 2017. Career Education board visits all academies twice per year to ensure fidelity. The Career Academy Board said that they need to focus on Middle Schools now. The rubric has been changed to meet the needs of each middle school. As a result of the results of the 5 year plan, we are a Ford Innovation district. People from around the country come here to tour our schools to learn what we are doing. East Lake Middle will most likely be highly requested for touring because of what we are doing here. Students in Academies are performing at a much higher rate than kids in non-academy programs. Students can opt out if they determine it is not the right fit for them. The next 5 year plan states 90% of students in an academy, with 50% of students graduating with certification, and 35% leaving middle school with certification.

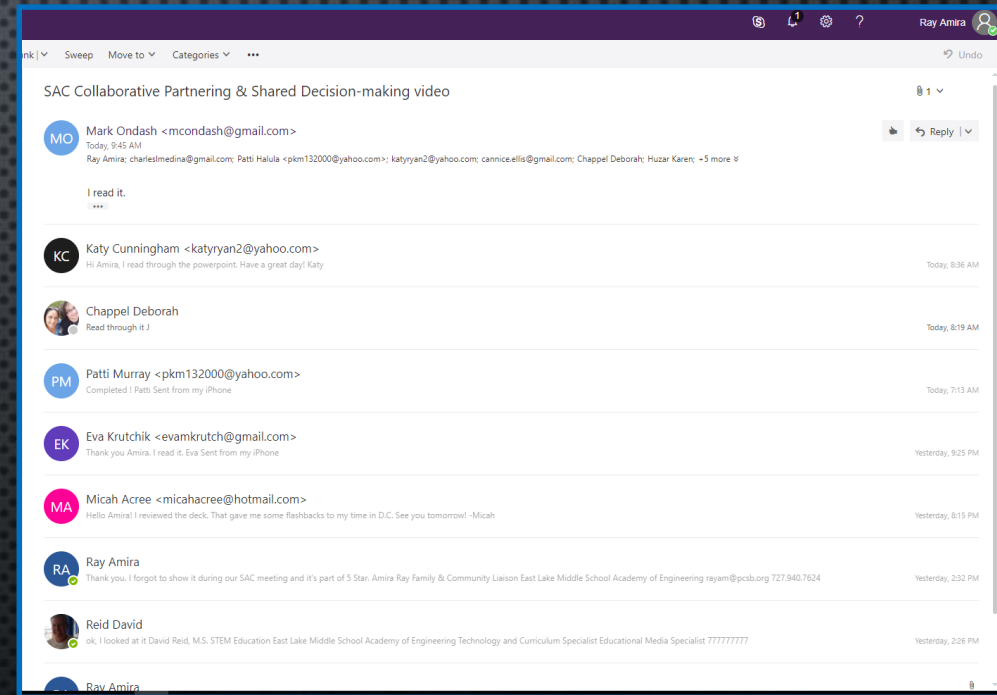

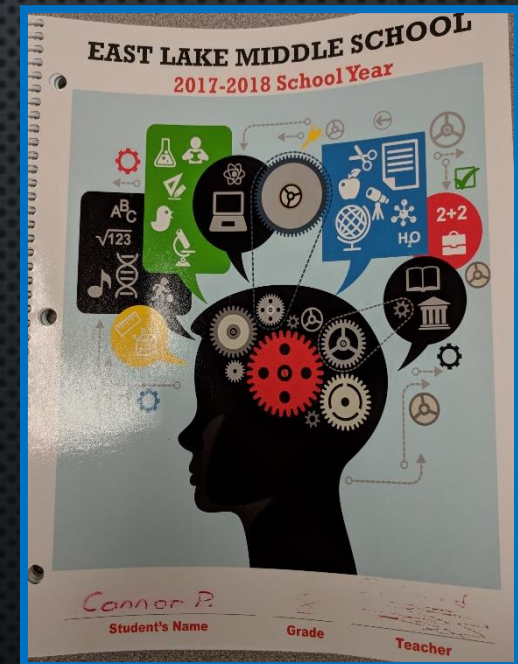
