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Coaches Curriculum Update



Curriculum coaches: MATH: Jenna Parker SCIENCE: Dayna Petruccelli ELA: Guiliana Smith & Kelley Papinchak

Math (K-5) Ways to support your child's learning at home.

- Kg: Practice counting items and writing numbers at home.
- 1st: Numbers within 10. Count forward and back, add and subtract.
- 2nd: Numbers within 100. Count forward and back, add and subtract, create flash cards.
- 3rd: Patterns in multiplication. Practice multiplication tables and create flash cards.
- 4th: Multiplication and division facts, factors and multiples. Create flash cards.
- 5th: Addition, subtraction, multiplication and division of decimals.

Please practice on XtraMath, a free program that helps with multiplication & division facts.

ELA (3rd—5th) Scholars in grades 3-5 will be working on Opinion writing during our next unit. Please promote your scholars writing stamina *have them practice writing at home.* Give them topics to write about and read their writing with them.

It's important that scholars are given time at home to read and write! This will build their love of reading as well as their stamina for FSA. Ask your scholars questions about what they are reading or let them read their writing out loud to you. You can always allow them to work on IReady while they are at home.

All scholars will be working through literature standards where they will be comparing and contrasting themes, setting and plots of stories. Third grade is reading Voices in the Park, fourth is reading Tiger Rising, and fifth is reading Number the Stars. Virtual students may check out books to use during this unit.

ELA (K-2nd) Kindergarten Scholars are growing as readers and writers. Students are paying close attention to print on the page and using meaning, syntax and structure to gain information. Retelling is still a large focus as well as bringing what they know about letters and sounds to their writing. First Grade Scholars are retelling stories in order, and determining the lesson learned. They are also excited to write an Opinion Essay. Second Grade Scholars are focusing on fiction stories, analyzing characters and exploring how illustrations tell us details about the characters, setting and plot. They begin writing Opinion Essays and will pick their own topic and develop reasons to support their opinions.

SCIENCE: Kg- Physical Science-Changing Objects and Sounds 1st-Physical Science: Physical Changes ... 2nd- Physical Science: Observing and Measuring Objects 3rd- Physical Science: Changing States of Matter ... 4th-Physical Science: Changes in Materials and Seeing Sound ... 5th- Big Idea 10 and 11- different forms of energy.
