Reminders

Please remember how important it is for your child to have regular attendance at school. Some things that you can do to help your child attend regularly are: set an appropriate time for them to go to bed, many parents remove all electronics at bedtime from their child's bedroom at bedtime, have them get up in the morning early enough to get to school on time, feed them a healthy breakfast to start their day, have a backup plan in case their regular way of getting to school falls through, and encourage them to be in their classroom seated before the bell every day. If you have any problems getting your child to school regularly and on-time, please contact our school social worker for support in problem solving.

Fact-The majority of Bardmoor students miss 5 or less days per school year. The majority of our students are in their desks on time every day. Help your child with these important life-long habits that will directly contribute to their success.

Fact: The great majority of our children are NEVER tardy! Do you know how many tardies your child has? Even ten minutes of missed school can lead to missing important instruction and assignments. It also sets up bad habits for life. Punctuality is an important part of creating a successful future. We need to support our children to be on time every day.

Updates on Attendance and Absences

The School District has recently changed the way that absences are reported to schools. In an effort to identify trends in absences, the Pinellas County School Board now requires teachers to record the reason for each student absence. This provides us with a better understanding of why our students are missing school and identify trends that will help us to provide better support. The great majority of our Bardmoor parents usually provide teachers with a reason for absences anyway, and we thank you. This change in how absences are recorded by teachers is mandated by the School District in an effort to identify barriers to attendance and to better support parents with overcoming problems that may be inhibiting their child from attending school. This state wide effort is intended to provide greater understanding and support for parents. We thank you for understanding this new process and for your support of your student. Also remember-you can report absences on our Bardmoor website. All parents/guardians are responsible for reporting absences to the school.

Character Trait of the Month

This month's character trait is Tolerance. At home you can help teach tolerance by setting a good example, among other things. *KidsHealth's* article, *Teaching Your Child Tolerance* states that, "Talking together about tolerance and respect helps kids learn more about the values you want them to have. Giving them opportunities to play and work with others is important as well."

These opportunities allow children to see that everyone has something special to bring to the table—immersing themselves in the differences and similarities that surround them. Things to try: 1. Show an attitude of respect for others. 2. Be aware of the way you speak about others who are different from yourself. 3. Answer questions children have about differences with honesty and respect. This demonstrates that it is okay to notice and discuss differences as long as it is done in a respectful manner. 4. Recognize and respect differences within your own family. Value the uniqueness of everyone in your family— their individual abilities, interests, etc. 5. Emphasize the GOLDEN RULE — Treating others the way that you want to be treated. 6.
