An Important Reminder about your Child's Attendance for the New Year!

- * Your child is expected to maintain a 90% or higher attendance rate.
- * If your child misses more than 10% of days in any given month, they will be referred to the school's attendance review team and monitored for the year. Consistent truancy will result in a referral to the Truancy Court and result in State Attorney Involvement for parents.
- * Your child's Perfect Attendance means that they are in school every day from first bell to last bell-without being tardy or early releases. Perfect attendance awards are handed out every month with a certificate and a small token or toy!
- * Did you know that missing just 10 minutes of instruction will result in your child missing: important announcements, direct instruction time, independent reading, and interrupts the flow of learning for the entire classroom? In addition frequent absences, tardiness, and early releases send a message to your child about the importance of school.
- * Providing a consistent education is one of the most important ways that you parent your child. Research overwhelmingly indicates that consistent attendance is directly related to success in school. Also, please remember, if your child is ill, a phone call or note from a parent/guardian with a legitimate reason is required in order for your child's absence to be excused by the school.
- * Join us in our mission to improve our school's perfect attendance.

- Children need the 4 “A”s as well as the 3 “R”s: Attention, appreciation, affection, and acceptance. Some researchers believe every child is gifted-If we just look for the ways.
- Encourage children to read biographies about successful people. As children learn about the traits that make others successful, that are often motivated to adopt those same success patterns in their own lives.
- Motivate your children in math by challenging them to figure out how much change you should get back from a purchase. If they get the amount right, they get to keep the change.
- Provide an environment (through age appropriate toys, activities, etc.) that allows children to freely explore and to see the effect of their actions (i.e. Toys that have visible or tangible changes when moved).
- Allow children ample time when working to allow for persistence. When children are deeply involved with an activity, make sure that they can finish without interruption. Resist the natural urge to “help,” and let the child know if, for example, we have to go to the grocery store in a few minutes.
- Provide situations that give children an acceptable challenge. Activities that are slightly difficult for the child will be more motivation and provide for stronger feelings of success when accomplished. This may take some trial and error at first.
- Give children opportunities to evaluate their own accomplishments. Rather than stating that you think they have done a good job, ask them what they think of their work. You’ll never go wrong by asking the question, “What do YOU think?”

The world through a child’s eyes is an awesome place. Allow children to explore and discover their world. Around every corner is an experience just waiting to surprise and excite young growing minds; all they need is a small amount of direction and a large amount of freedom. It is not necessary to reward children for their own actions as they attempt to control their environment. The feelings of accomplishment they gain from results of those actions will be reward enough.

Remember, the habits and attitudes toward learning that are formed in these early years set the mood for all future learning.
