There is a lot going on over the month of March at Bardmoor Elementary! On March 3rd, fourth and fifth graders will be taking the Florida Standards Assessment for writing. On March 10th-20th, first and second grade students will be taking the SAT-10 Standardized Test. On March 24th, third and fourth grade will be taking the Florida Standards Assessment for English Language Arts. Fifth grade will take all of their assessments and fourth and fifth grade will take the math assessment in April, after Spring Break.

Spring Break is March 30th-April 5th. It is a much deserved break for both students and teachers, but while we are all relaxing we should be reading and keeping our skills sharp in preparation for the end of the school year. Remember, students can do STMath, Ticket to Read and FCAT Explorer (3rd, 4th, and 5th grade). These are all found on the Pinellas County website in the **Beyond the Classroom** section. Students should know their passwords as they work on the programs at school.

Registration for Summer Bridge will also open on March 16th. Summer Bridge will be at Bardmoor again this year, which is a great opportunity to continue with teachers who know the students. Summer Bridge is designed to engage children in learning over the summer so that they are continuing to master skills and prepare for the next grade level. 
**From P.E. Department:

COUNSELOR'S

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The Character Word of the Month for the Month of March is: **Honesty**

Honesty is one of the many challenging values you must teach your child. In their younger years, children don't truly understand the harmful consequences of being dishonest, so they test with fibs. It takes years to instill a sense of honesty in a child, and it takes a great deal of patience on a parent.

The following steps give you some helpful tools:

1. Model honesty for your child. The most important tool any parent can use is practicing what you teach. If you lie to your children or they overhear you lie to someone else, they think it is acceptable behavior.
2. Encourage your child to tell the truth and to share their thoughts and feelings with you. If they know they can be honest with you about what's on their mind without you getting mad or critical, they see that honesty is the best approach.
3. Avoid questions that make it easy for kids to lie. If you already know your child spilled her juice on the carpet, don't ask "Did you spill this juice?" This question encourages kids to lie to stay out of trouble. Instead simply say, "Please clean up your spilled juice."
4. Be mindful of little white lies, how you use them and how you explain them to your child. You don't want your child to be so honest that she hurts someone's feelings. Even if she hates the dress her grandma made for her, she needs to learn how to say something generic instead of being brutally honest.
5. Give praise when your child tells the truth, particularly if you've reprimanded her before for lying. Praise boosts self confidence and encourages positive behavior.
6. Don't lose your temper when your child lies. Take the circumstance and turn it into a teaching experience by asking her, "How do you think you should have handled this?" This approach works much better than simply scolding harshly and punishing her.

Most people would agree that it is important to teach honesty and integrity to your children. However if you were to sit down and write a list of character traits you want your child to develop, chances are honesty would at least be in the top five. After all, without honesty, our children will be less able to make friends, succeed in a career, and have a happy marriage.

Pinellas Virtual School part-time enrollment in full swing

Pinellas Virtual School part-time enrollment for fall and spring courses for the 2015-16 school year is underway through March 27. Enrollment in Pinellas Virtual School is one way students can meet the state's online credit requirement. Under Florida's Digital Learning Act, students are required to complete an online course as part of the state's 24-credit minimum needed to graduate. Honors courses and popular electives, such as HOPE and Driver's Education are offered as part-time curriculum aligned with Pinellas County Schools. Families can enroll online at www.virtualschool.pcsb.org. Pinellas Virtual School will offer students an opportunity to enroll *full-time* in April.


