



#### Hello!

If I have not had the pleasure of meeting you in-person, I am Courtney Klingman, MSW, School Social Worker at Ponce de Leon. I have been at Ponce for the last five years, and have thoroughly enjoyed getting to know so many students and families!

Did you know that starting as early as kindergarten, good attendance has been shown to increase the likelihood of a student **graduating from high school**? You can have a significant impact on your child's educational success, simply by ensuring they are at school each day, on-time.

Other benefits from good attendance include: higher reading levels, improved math skills, less difficulty transitioning to school for younger students, free breakfast and free lunch at Ponce! **School starts promptly at 8:35am**; if your child is planning on eating breakfast at school, it is recommended they are dropped off at 8:05am. If they are not joining us for breakfast, they should be dropped off between 8:20 and 8:25am to ensure they have enough time to get into their class and settled.

When a child arrives late to school, it significantly impacts their day and disrupts their classmates. Not only are they missing out on valuable <u>reading instruction</u>, they do not have time to easily transition from home expectations to school expectations with the rest of their class.

At Ponce, we typically have about 20-30 students who are late each morning, which is a significant number of students missing out on important instruction. *Please help our teachers and your child by getting to school on-time*.

#### What we need from you!

#### Here are ways to ensure attendance success:

Build regular routines for bed time and the morning.

Talk about the importance of regular attendance and about how your child feels about school.

Don't permit missing school unless your child is truly sick. Use a thermometer to check for a fever. Only keep your child home if they have vomited more than twice in 24 hours.

Remember that frequent stomach aches and headaches may be signs of anxiety, so please contact your child's teacher, the school counselor, or school social worker if you feel your child may be experiencing a social/emotional concern that may cause them to miss school. We are here to help.

Avoid medical appointments and extended trips when school is in session.

Develop back up plans for getting to school if something comes up. Ask a family member, neighbor or another parent for help.

Seek support from school staff or community groups to help with transportation, health problems, or no safe path to school. (Source: www.Attendanceworks.org)
