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Visitor Procedures – (New)

The recent tragedy at Stoneman-Douglas High School in Broward County has placed many of us in our community at a heightened state of awareness. Many parents and community members have contacted our school to discuss what we do in the event of a similar situation like the one in Broward County. For your child's safety, we are unable to give specific details regarding our processes and procedures. Please know that the schools in our district continually review, practice, and monitor all safety procedures. At Davis, we routinely conduct practice drills that, in the event of an emergency, our students and staff are prepared to be safe. As a school community we are diligent about school safety and are constantly working to maintain a safe and welcoming learning environment. review the reminders for visitors to the following changes that have been put in place due to our review process.

- ALL visitors MUST have a visitor sticker that is visible and displayed on their <u>upper body</u>.
- All visitors, including our Level I & II volunteers, must sign in and out through the main office. In the event of an emergency, this is how we keep you safe.
- Parents and family members visiting for lunch must remain in the cafeteria/courtyard area. If another student (other than your child) wishes to join you, they must have a written note from their parent to the teacher giving them permission.
- (New Procedure) All lunch and breakfast visitors, including our Level I & II volunteers will be given a visitors sticker with a red slash on it. These visitors are only permitted to use the main hallway and courtyard to access the cafeteria for lunch with your student.
- In order to be in the classroom pods, volunteers must have teacher approval.
- Level II volunteers in the classroom and on field trips are encouraged to wear their district issued badge for I.D. purposes.

 Those visitors that are "out of area" or not properly identified will be directed accordingly.

Thank you for working with us to ensure the safety of our students and staff and I appreciate your patience as we work to make these procedures routine.


