A Message from Mr. Durst

What an amazing month of teaching and learning here at Davis. We have combed over our student performance data from first semester and are working diligently to address our areas of needed growth. Our school continues to show great academic growth in reading. In fact, our performance in reading is forecasted to be higher than ever before. We have already increased the percentage of students showing proficiency in reading to 72%. Our performance in mathematics on the Winter MAP assessment projected our proficiency to be at 58% with our biggest area of focus still on students showing growth or learning gains. With that said we are approximately 15% lower in math proficiency from the Winter of 2020 assessment a year ago. Mathematics was predicted to "slide" much further than reading during the pandemic. Please know that we have a comprehensive mid-year plan in place to ensure our students achieve their learning goals.

You may be thinking, "How can I help my child?". The biggest impact parents and guardians can have on math achievement is to encourage your child to have open dialog with teachers, confer with your child regarding their performance in math, and complete their recommended 5-10 lessons per week on Dreambox for grades K-2nd and 10-15 lessons for grades 3-5.

Dreambox and iStation are computer programs all students at school have access to by logging into Clever. Both programs are designed to support your child at their instructional level and their personalized needs for math and reading. Each program has a weekly goal for students to reach to stay on track and move them further in their learning.



Dreambox, which supports math learning, has a goal of 5-10 lessons each week for students in grades Kindergarten to 3rd grade. 4th and 5th graders have an expectation of at least 10 lessons each



week.. iStation has been the reading program in use by Pinellas county for several years. All students are assigned at least 30 minutes of iStation a week.

Counselor's Corner

<u>Classroom Lessons</u>

As a part of my comprehensive school counseling program, I visit classrooms approximately once every six weeks to provide direct instruction on a variety of topics. Classroom lessons fall into the academic, career, and/or personal-social domains and are aligned with the <u>Florida Standards</u>, <u>Florida School Counseling Framework</u>, and the <u>American School Counseling Association mindsets and behaviors</u>.

In February, I provided lessons on the following topics:

Kindergarten – Perseverance 1st – Diversity 2nd – Conflict Resolution 3rd – Bullying Prevention 4th – Conflict Resolution 5th – Perspective

Teach Your Child to be Honest

1. Reward the Truth

Reward honesty with loads of praise and hugs. It will build self-confidence and reinforce the positive behavior.

2. The Art of "Spin"

The brutal truth should not always be spoken. We have all heard the saying, "If you don't have something nice to say, don't say anything at all."

3. The Hard Truth

Correct morals always trump protecting the feelings of someone who is doing wrong. Wrong is always wrong.

4. The Apple Doesn't Fall Far From The Tree

As is always the case, you are the role model. You do not want your child to hear you telling a lie or see you perform a dishonest act.

5. Do Not Lead the Witness

Though it's tempting to test them, try to avoid asking questions that give your child a chance to not be honest. This leads her to believe she might have a way out and could possibly pass blame elsewhere.

6. Truth or Consequences

It's important that there be consequences for lying. Appropriate discipline should be carried out and followed through.

7. Correct Mistakes

Catching your child being dishonest is a good time to help him correct the mistake. Talk about how he could have responded or reacted differently.

8. Your Word Is Gold

One of the most important character traits a person can possess is keeping and following through on promises made. Teach your children to be people who consider their word gold. When they give it, they don't break it.

9. What's Yours Is Yours

The best policy is to teach a child early on that what they have belongs to them. What other people have belongs to that person.

10. Look for honest friends

If your child's friends lie and cheat, you child may follow that example. But if your child's friends are upstanding and honest, your son or daughter will be that much better off.

tips to reduce **TEST ANXIETY** in CHILDREN



PUT TESTS INTO PERSPECTIVE

- Encourage children to do their best, but remind them that one test won't make or break their future.
- Tell they will be loved and valued no matter what test score they earn.
- Explain this test will provide helpful information about what they're great at and what they still need to practice.

HELP THEM PRACTICE

- If your child is nervous, start by asking why they feel nervous.
- Consider finding practice tests online you can discuss together.
- Don't push your child to study for the test; these tests are meant to measure what your child already knows.

PROVIDE USEFUL TEST-TAKING TIPS

- Answer the easiest questions first, mark difficult questions and return to them later
- Use process of elimination, crossing out the answer choices you know are wrong
- Make an educated guess when needed
- Read all the answer choices before choosing one
- If penalized for incorrect answers, don't guess unless you can eliminate some answer choices
- If aren't penalized for incorrect answers, don't leave any questions blank. If time is about to run out, bubble . something for each unanswered question

29 TEACH CALMING STRATEGIES

- Experiment with calming strategies to find some go-to techniques.
- Remind they won't know every single answer on the test, and that's okay.
- Give them a plan for what they will do if they don't know an answer.
- Equip your child with a few strategies that effectively calm them. Spend some time practicing these strategies before test day.

PROVIDE ENCOURAGEMENT

- If your child voices a negative statement, like, "I know I'm going to fail," acknowledge your child's feelings: "I know you're feeling nervous about the test. Tests can be scary."
- Counter with a positive and encouraging statement: "You've practiced really hard and learned a lot this year. You might know a lot of the answers and get a higher score than you're expecting."
- You can also leave your child encouraging messages in a backpack or on the mirror with dry-erase markers.

HELP THEM FEEL THEIR BEST ON TEST DAY

- Choose movement and exercise
- · Get plenty of rest
- Stick to your usual bedtime routine
- Avoiding excessive screen time
- Providing a protein-rich breakfast in the morning, like oatmeal or eggs
- · Keeping conversation positive, encouraging, and lighthearted
- Share laughter and sing favorite songs on the way to school, if driving. Listen to our Big Life Journal playlists on Spotify!
- · Leave your child with a big hug and words of encouragement
