Summer Bridge Registration

Summer will soon be here and Pinellas County Schools is thrilled to share information about our **Summer Bridge** program. Summer Bridge is an extended



learning opportunity designed for all students. The purpose of this exciting program is to provide students with continuous learning through the summer to ensure they will be ready to begin the next school year with confidence and success.

Summer Bridge will provide learning opportunities during the summer so students will be more prepared for success when the 2017-2018 school year begins. The 6-week program will include acceleration and enhancement of skills in reading, mathematics and science, and individualized instruction in the three core subjects using a blended model of the arts, technology, small group instruction, hands-on labs, and project-based learning.

Parents may choose to register their student(s) to any one of the 42 elementary sites, however please be advised that parents will be responsible for providing transportation for their child to and from the Summer Bridge Elementary School program. The program will run from 8:35 a.m. to 1:35 p.m. Mondays-Thursdays from June 6 to July 13, 2017.

If you have forgotten your ID or password, or experience other problems, contact the front office to have your password reset. If you do not have access to Internet service, you may register at Davis. Please note the closest Summer Bridge site will be McMullen Booth Elementary.

Dress Code Reminder

Its germ season again! It's the time of year for illness and germs to spread through classrooms and schools. This is especially true for influenza-like illness, and gastrointestinal illness! There are a number of ways to promote staff and student well-being through this germy time of year:

- Promote good hand washing.
- Clean and disinfect high-touch surfaces and objects.
- Teach students to avoid touching their eyes, nose and mouth.
- Teach students to cover their nose and mouth with a tissue.
- Encourage staff and students to <u>stay home</u> when they are sick.

School Health Services has guideline for exclusion from school when students and staff are ill. In general, everyone who has a temp of 101.F should stay home from school. They can return when they have been fever free for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medication. School nurses are always available to go into classrooms and teach students healthy habits.
