

Just a few reminders regarding arrival and dismissal

- Adult supervision on campus begins at 8:05 AM, so please do not drop off your children before this time. We continue to have students dropped off before 8:05. We will formally notify parents who are continually dropping their children off before the designated time.
- Parents may accompany their child to breakfast in the cafeteria after coming through the main office. For student safety reasons, <u>parents are</u> <u>to remain in the main hallways and are not</u> <u>permitted to enter the classroom pods or</u> <u>visit teachers.</u>

Parents choosing to use the parking lot at Heritage United Methodist Church for drop off or pick up are responsible for walking to and from the campus for drop off and/or pick up.
- Please do not use the bus circle on the south end of the campus for drop off or pick up. This area is designated for school buses, day care vans, and staff parking.
- Our car circle has become more efficient, please make sure your child is picked up by 2:45 PM each day.


