#### HOW TO GET FINANCIAL AID?

1. Apply for admission to your future school. You can't get money if you don't attend that college.

2. Fill out the FAFSA, which is the Free Application for Federal Student Aid. This is a must! Get it on-line at <u>www.fafsa.gov</u>. January is the time to do it for fall admission. Complete the form this year for summer admission.

3. Wait for a "package." This is a financial award package from one or more of the colleges/ universities to which you applied. The \$ amount they offer you is based on your FAFSA information. Each school may offer different types of aid through CSS/Profile,

4. Pick your package. Once you have decided on an offer, send your materials to the financial aid office at your college/university.

- Complete the FAFSA if attending college summer term 2018
- Winter Break Dec. 23– Jan. 8

- Submit your FAFSA form for fall term 2018

- Apply for scholarships
- Finalize college choices

# FEBRUARY 2018

- ACT February 10
- Be sure all necessary materials have been sent to your chosen colleges
- Don't get "senioritis:" colleges want to see strong second semester grades
- Expect to receive your Student Aid Report (SAR), which outlines Expected Family Contributions for 2017-18 school year.
- Apply for scholarships

# MARCH 2018

- Deadline for April ACT = March 9
- Anticipate award letters from financial aid outlining your financial aid assistance
- Be sure your colleges/universities have received all necessary information
- SAT– March 10
- Continue scholarship search
  - Apply for scholarships

#### APRIL 2018

- ACT April 14
- Prepare for May AP Examinations, if applicable
- Admissions decisions arrive
- Review college acceptances; perhaps revisit your top choices
- Review financial aid packages; talk with college financial aid officers
- Check dates for housing deposits
  - Apply for scholarships

#### MAY 2018

- SAT May 5
- Deadline for June ACT = May 4
- May Seniors final exams
- \*AP Exams
- \*Graduation Practice (TBD)
- \*Graduation (TBD)
- Order final transcripts
- Apply for scholarships
- Update and finalize Bright Futures application
- Last day of school May 24<sup>th</sup>

#### JUNE 2018

- SAT June 2
- ACT June 9
- Notify colleges you did not choose
- Attend College/University Orientation
- Update and finalize Bright Futures application
