What is PBS?

- A collaborative assessment-based process to developing effective interventions for problem behavior.
- Aims to build effective environments in which positive behavior is more effective than problem behavior.
- Emphasizes the use of preventative, teaching, and reinforcement-based strategies to achieve meaningful and durable behavior and lifestyle outcomes.

What does PBS look like in our school?

- ➤ Uses school-wide expectations and rules in specific settings to teach students appropriate behavior.
- ➤ Reward system (Super Sprockets) to encourage and model appropriate behavior and effective consequences to discourage inappropriate behavior.
- ➤ Get in Gear Assemblies to reward appropriate behavior and learning gains.
- ➤ Big Events to reward students with no referrals and events that students have saved their Super Sprockets to attend.
- Use data from referrals and minor-infractions to target problem behavior.

What are the levels of PBS?

- ✓ <u>School Wide:</u> Procedures and processes intended for all students, staff, in specific settings across campus.
- ✓ <u>Classroom:</u> Processes and procedures that reflect school-wide expectations for student behavior coupled with pre-planned strategies applied within classrooms.

Positive Behavior Support (PBS)

- PBS is our school-wide discipline plan and the way of work to monitor behavior. The PBS goals in our School Improvement Plan are to increase the number of students being successful and to reduce the number of students receiving numerous referrals. Students need to be taught the correct behavior and this is best done through modeling and repeated practice. Super Sprockets reward students when they are showing the correct behavior. Achievement scores also increase when students are actively listening and participating in class. Parents are needed to help with different activities that support good behavior at Jamerson.
- Our PTA Book Store is open the 1st Tuesday during lunch for all students. Super Sprockets or Learning Earnings coupons (Grades 3-5) may be spent. It is still just 5 Super Sprockets for each book or 25 Learning Earnings Points. The PBS School store will be open for K 2 grade students only on the 3rd Tuesday of the month. Popcorn will be served on the 2nd Tuesday of the month for 20 Super Sprockets or a Learning Earnings Voucher (100 points).
- More volunteers are always welcome, especially on the popcorn day. Other volunteers will be needed during our Big Events throughout the year. These events are for students that have had no referrals, and have the Super Sprockets or Learning Earning points to buy an event. Please contact Pat Gray, Guidance Counselor, or Lizz Singh if you would like to volunteer for the store or any events.
