Nurse's Notes from Nurse Leslie



Hello Sea Turtles!! In this crazy time, we are all in uncharted territory. You all know how hard your teachers are working to help your children through remote learning. What you may not know, is that all those other faces you normally see at SHES are continuing to work hard behind the scenes.

I am still here for your students. It's different because I'm not in my clinic, ready to dole out hugs and ice, but I'm still here. If you need to reach me, call the school and dial extension 2026. That will be forwarded to my home phone during school hours. You can also e-mail me at johnsonles@pcsb.org.

While we all stay safer at home, here are some tips to help your family avoid illness:

- 1. Eat healthy: Fruits, veggies, lean protein & complex carbs (i.e., whole grain pasta or grains)
 - 2. Get plenty of rest: 8 9.5 hrs. of good, solid sleep
 - 3. Drink water: Eight 8 oz. glasses per day
 - 4. Wash your hands with soap and water
 - Hand sanitizer next best option if you don't have soap and water.
 - Wash after using the restroom
 - · Wash if you sneeze or cough into your hands

(it is best to cough/sneeze into your elbow or down the front of your shirt)

- Wash before preparing food
- · Wash if you've helped someone who is sick
 - WASH WASH WASH!
 - 5. Avoid touching your face
