Principal's Pen

We are quickly approaching our 100<sup>th</sup> day of school! Quite an exciting milestone in an otherwise unique year! We are so very excited to have the majority of our Sea Turtles back on campus! In January our amazing teachers wrapped up our second round of district assessments and have been taking time to review data, and with students set goals for this grading period. Our cycle assessments help teachers determine the progress on student mastery of the standards as well as determining the direction of instruction in the classroom. Grading period 2 report cards will be sent home on Tuesday, February 2<sup>nd</sup>. Please take time to review these with your student, celebrate successes and set goals. It is very important that communication occurs between you and your child's teacher, so you, as a parent, are fully aware of your scholar's strengths and areas in need of improvement so we can work as a team to support their needs. Regular daily attendance, checking Portal, and reviewing returned assignments are all ways to ensure that your scholar is performing successfully. If you have any questions, do not hesitate to reach out to the classroom teacher!

Florida Standards Assessment (FSA) in grades 3-5 will begin taking place in early April. In addition to information shared by the classroom teacher, parents can visit the Florida Department of Education site <a href="https://fsassessments.org/users/students-and-families.stml">https://fsassessments.org/users/students-and-families.stml</a> for practice tests and general information. Reading and writing assignments sent home by teachers are one way students are preparing, in addition to what is happening in their classroom. An important piece of information to have as a 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grade parent is that the writing score a student earns is part of a student's overall ELA (English/Language Arts) FSA score. So the writing assessment is just as important as the reading portion. A "Save the Date" timeline will be sent home soon with testing windows which will help with personal planning and scheduling for 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grade students.

Ready, Set! Kindergarten! was very successful again this year, even in the virtual setting! Kindergarten registration is now open. Reach out to our front office for information. Also, this month PTA will be hosting a Virtual Bingo for Books night! I hope you will join us for the fun. Check out the invitation in this month's newsletter!

Finally parents, community members and virtual mentors, thank you as always for your continued support in these trying times. Our SHES Faculty members are working hard to meet the needs of our students after a very inconsistent lapse in face to face instruction. Your positive words and gestures of encouragement are uplifting and very much appreciated. You help SHES to shine!

## **Annual ESE Parent Survey is underway**

It is time for the Florida Department of Education's annual Exceptional Student Education Parent Survey. Each year, the department surveys parents of students with an individual education plan (IEP) who receive special education services to determine how well schools are promoting their involvement in their children's education.

If your child receives special education services, make your voice heard. Take the ESE Parent Survey.

Feedback helps the state and the school district improve educational services for children with special needs and their families. The survey is confidential, but Pinellas County Schools receives overall results and improves ESE services based on parent feedback. As a result, the district has created a helpline to assist families with navigating special education services and implemented options to make ESE Advisory Committee Meetings accessible to families throughout the county.

Parents can take the ESE Parent Survey at <a href="www.esesurvey.com">www.esesurvey.com</a> or complete a paper survey distributed by their child's school. The survey closes May 31.

#### Notes from Nurse Jen!

Remember National Children's Dental Health Month with these Oral Hygiene Tips:

February is National Children's Dental Health Month, but you and your children should think about Dental Health all year long. It's a great opportunity to make sure you're on top of your child's dental hygiene.

Here are some ways you can be proactive about your child's oral health:

#### Don't Wait

As soon as your child's first tooth appears, you can start oral hygiene practices, wiping their teeth clean with a damp cloth or soft brush before moving to a toothbrush.

#### **Practice Proper Brushing Technique**

You can help your young child brush their teeth with training toothpaste and a small toothbrush.

#### **Teach Children to Brush Twice Daily**

For school-age children, brushing with a fluoride toothpaste will keep away tooth decay. Children should also be flossing twice a day to remove plaque between teeth before it hardens into tartar.

#### Help Your Child Keep a Balanced Diet

The dentist can partner with you to create a plan to keep your child's mouth healthy. In everyday life, a balanced diet of vitamins and minerals, calcium and phosphorous not only helps general health, but it can also help keep their teeth strong.
