2018-2019 Safety Harbor Elementary Arrival and Dismissal Processes

In an effort to keep your child safe, we have the following policies and processes concerning arrival and dismissal. With a new semester beginning, please take a moment to revisit these processes to increase safety and efficiency for all families during these important times of day. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact the front office.

STUDENT ARRIVAL PROCESS

Before 8:15 a.m.: Students are not allowed on school grounds unless enrolled in the YMCA, under parent supervision, or have prior permission as member of a club.

South and West Walkers/Bike Riders enter campus through the South/Kindergarten Pod gate only utilizing crossing guards. Secured bike parking is available.

Please do not cross MLK with your child at 6th Avenue near the car circle exit and where no crossing guard is present.

It is dangerous due to the constant flow of traffic and does not demonstrate safe pedestrian behavior.

North and East Walkers/Bike Riders arrive on campus at the front of the main building near the bus lane, entering in the East/Media Center gate. Secured bike parking is available.

8:15 a.m.: Students may go to the cafeteria for breakfast or they must go to their designated waiting area until the 8:35 a.m. bell. At 8:35 a.m. students may go to classrooms, where teachers will greet them.

STUDENT DISMISSAL PROCESS

2:40 p.m.: Patrols report to duty. Day Care vans, Bus Riders and Car Riders are dismissed from classrooms. 2:45 p.m.: Walkers, bike riders and YMCA students are dismissed. North and East Walkers/Bike Riders exit campus at the crosswalk at the East/Media Center gate. South and West Walkers/Bike Riders, exit campus at the crosswalk at the South/ Kindergarten Pod gate.

3:00 p.m.: Patrols are off duty. All students should be off school grounds unless in the YMCA program or participating in an after school program.

CAR CIRCLE AND PARKING LOT PROCEDURES

SAFETY FIRST AT SAFETY HARBOR

Refrain from the use of cell phones and smoking, in the car circle, including the use of vapor products. There is no smoking allowed on school board property.

Pay attention to your driving by maintaining a safe speed (speed limit is 5 miles per hour). Stop at all stop signs.

Watch out for pedestrians in crosswalks.

RESPECT

In the morning and in the afternoon, there is One Way traffic around the perimeter of the campus during specific times.

Please be courteous to all motorists and staff members.

Pull all the way up to the vehicle in front of you, before dropping off and picking up your child, <u>leaving no gaps between cars</u>, especially once you entered the car circle.

With multiple adults on duty monitoring student safety, drop off each morning is the entire length of the car circle, including Kindergarten. Students should disembark at the first place your vehicle stops in the car circle where a guardrail opening is visible.

Delays due to selective colors/locations requires your vehicle to stop multiple times in the car circle, therefore delaying drop off for others.

RESPONSIBILITY

you exit the car circle.

Be on time to drop off your child in the morning. According to Pinellas County Schools Student Code of Conduct, a student is tardy when he/she is not in his/her seat when the bell rings at 8:45 a.m.

The car circle gate closes promptly at 8:45 a.m. and students arriving after the gate closes need to go to the front office to get a tardy slip with their parent. Be on time to pick up your child in the afternoon. **Students should be picked up from school no later than 3:15 p.m.** School ends at 2:45 p.m. Staff members are on duty until 3:15 p.m. Parents that have not picked up their child by 3:15 p.m. will need to come in and sign their child out. Place a sign on your dashboard or rear view mirror that clearly states your child's name and grade. Please leave this visible until your child is in the car and

The Vision, Hearing and Body Mass Index screenings which are required by the State of Florida for all public school children will be performed at SHES on January 31st and February 1st.

Kindergarten students will receive Vision/Hearing screenings, 1st grade will receive Vision/Hearing and BMI, and 3rd grade students will receive Vision and BMI screenings. Students who are new to Pinellas County since the last screening will also receive screenings.

If you do NOT wish for your child to be screened, you must notify the School Nurse IN WRITING at least 1 week prior to the screening date. Your child will bring home a letter on the day of their screening with the results of the screening.
