




Parents can now log on to the Student Reservation system to update their phone numbers and email addresses.

Providing up-to-date contact information will enable families to receive:

- Communications about emergencies or severe weather events
- Timely information about school or district events
- Information and status updates about choice and other special application opportunities

To update your information:

1. Visit <https://reservation.pcsb.org> and log in with your parent username (P.xxxxxx) and password. If you do not have a parent ID, you can get one by going to any school and presenting a valid photo ID.
2. Select the option: "Change Phone and Email Address Only"
3. Enter your child's name and date of birth or student ID number, and then update your phone number and email address.

**Remember: Updating the emergency contact card at your child's school does not update your contact information in the FOCUS Student Information System used to send automated phone calls and emails.**

## 5517.01 Policy against Bullying/Harassment (Grades K-12 and Adults)

### 5517.01 LA POLÍTICA CONTRA LA INTIMIDACIÓN Y EL ACOSO (K-12 grados y adultos)

In response to the state law, *the Jeffrey Johnston Stand Up for all Students Act*, the School Board adopted a policy that prohibits bullying as well as cyber bullying and harassment. The policy ensures that all students, employees, and volunteers learn and work in an environment that is safe, secure, and free from harassment and bullying of any kind. Florida is one of 50 states with a law regarding bullying in schools. The Policy defines Bullying, including cyber bullying, as systematically and chronically inflicting physical hurt or psychological distress on one or more students or employees and may involve but is not limited to: teasing, social exclusion, threat, intimidation, stalking, including cyberstalking, physical violence, theft, sexual, religious, or racial harassment, public humiliation, and destruction of property. The policy defines harassment as any threatening, insulting, or dehumanizing gesture, use of data or computer software, or written, verbal or physical conduct directed against a student or employee that: Places a student or employee in reasonable fear of harm to his or her person or damage to his or her property, has the effect of substantially interfering with a student's educational performance, opportunities, or benefits, has the effect of substantially disrupting the orderly operation of a school.

En respuesta a la ley estatal, *Jeffrey Johnston Stand Up for all Students Act*, la Junta Escolar ha adoptado una política que prohíbe la intimidación, así como también la intimidación cibernética y el acoso. Esta política asegura que todos los estudiantes, empleados y voluntarios aprendan y trabajen en una ambiente que sea seguro, sin peligros y libre de cualquier clase de intimidación y acoso. Florida es uno de los 50 estados que tiene una ley referente a la intimidación en las escuelas.

La política define la intimidación, incluyendo la intimidación cibernética como infligir dolor físico o angustia psicológica de manera sistemática y crónica a uno (1) o más estudiantes o empleados y pueden incluir entre otras: bromas, exclusión social, amenaza, hostigamiento, acoso, incluyendo acoso cibernético, violencia física, robo, acoso sexual, religioso o racial, humillación pública y destrucción de la propiedad. La política define el acoso como cualquier gesto amenazante, insultante o deshumanizante; uso de datos o programas computarizados; o conducta escrita, verbal o física dirigida contra un estudiante o empleado, que: Coloque al estudiante o empleado en temor razonable de daño a su persona o a su propiedad; tenga el efecto de interferir sustancialmente con el desempeño, oportunidades o beneficios educativos de un estudiante; tenga el efecto de perturbar sustancialmente la operación ordenada de la escuela.

We are committed to providing a safe learning environment and will not tolerate Bullying/Harassment or Teen Dating Violence and Abuse of any kind. Incidents can be reported to the principal or any staff member or reported online at one of the below links:
