DIGITAL MEDIA TV PRODUCTION

The Digital Media/TV Production program is under the direction of Mrs. Debra Rein-Cavagnaro a Certified Apple Final Cut Pro Trainer who teaches students practical skills in recording and editing video. Our students' short films have won many prizes at the local, regional and state levels. The students produce a daily news show that keeps Osceola Warriors informed and entertained. Our students learn skills that include script writing, lighting, camera operation and audio engineering, video editing, producing and directing. The students are responsible for the daily broadcast of the award winning program, O-Town Live. Our goals include developing solid production basics while providing a challenging curriculum for advancing students and improving overall job skills. Using our production studio and professional quality ENG/EFP/DSLR cameras, our students learn a multitude of valuable job skills. Students that move into the upper levels of television production will have the opportunity to learn industry standard software such as Final Cut Pro, Adobe Premiere Pro and After Effects. It is the goal of levels TV 3 and above to learn and ceritify in industry standard editing software Final Cut Pro X and Adobe Premiere Pro.

Successful completion of three years of TV Production courses allows students to be eligible for the Bright Futures Gold Seal Scholarship designation on their diploma. Osceola Digital Media/TV Production students will have the opportunity to earn valuable college credit through a partnership with St. Petersburg College. Dual enrollment Video Editing will be offered for Osceola students on our campus. Students looking forward to careers in broadcasting, technology applications and even management will benefit from the program.



TELEVISION PRODUCTION

The purpose of this program is to prepare students for initial emplyment as television production operators, television broadcast technicians, camera operators, all other professional/ paraprofessional technicians, video recording engineers, audio recording engineers, or to provide a foundation for college degree path opportunities in the television production industry. The content will include communication skills, leadership skills, human relations and employability skills, safe and efficient work practices, and preparation to assume responsibility for overall production of television studio activities including: scripts, lighting, taping and directing, electronic news gathering, and field production. This program focuses on broad transferable skills and stresses, understanding and demonstration of the following elements of the television production industry: planning, management, finance, technical and product skills, underlying principles of technology, labor issues, community issues and health, safety, and environmental issues. Laboratory activities are an integral part of this course and provide instruction in camera principles, audio and video control, lighting methods, control room, operation, and set preparation.
