To provide a superior educational climate for a diverse community of learners.

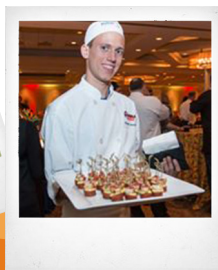
MISSION STATEMENT:

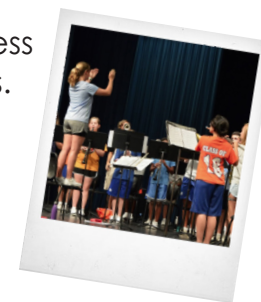
Our school was established in 1981, we became a fundamental program in 2006, and represent the colors blue and orange.

HOW TO USE THIS BOOKLET

Dates have not yet been approved.

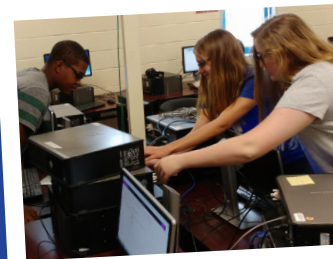
6. Private School Students need to bring:

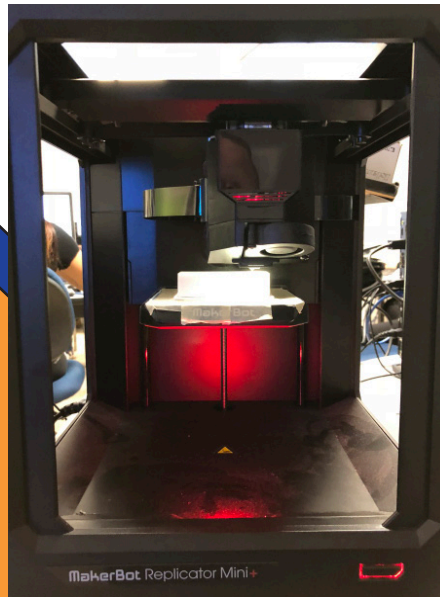

The purpose of this program is to provide students with a foundation of knowledge and technically oriented experiences in the study of the applications of engineering and its effect upon our lives and the choosing of an occupation. 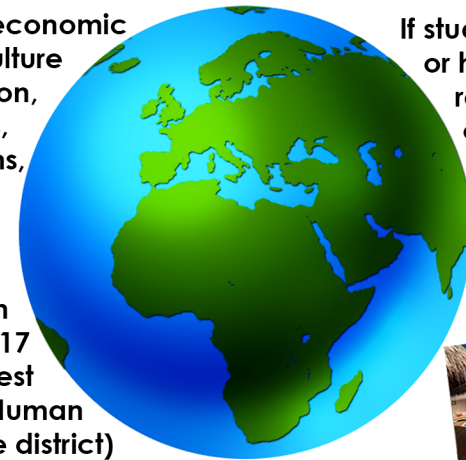
AP HUMAN GEOGRAPHY

↔ OPEN TO GRADES 9-12 ↔

Studies people, economic development, culture (language, religion, ethnicity), politics, migration patterns, urban land use, & settlements

Pass rate of exam was 67% in 2016-17 at Osceola (highest pass rate for AP Human Geography in the district)

If students score a 3 or higher, they will receive a college credit for the course, along with high school credit

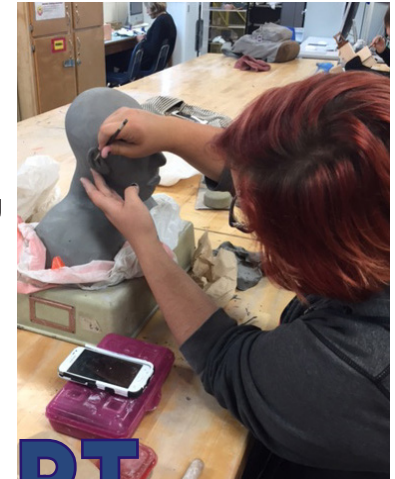
