Therefore, parents will be provided opportunities to give input in the development and decision-making process of all Title I activities related to the school. Families will rotate through interactive experiences with teachers explaining the activities and their purpose as well as showing how they can replicate at home and modify to meet the needs of our students.

Teachers notify parents prior to testing and offer conferences after each testing cycle and as needed to address student needs. Academic nights are offered to support parents and share instructional information and curriculum as well as transition events for Prekindergarten students. Students attends family nights and offers resources and support for all attendees.
