SPRINGING TOWARDS SUCCESS

Hello Thunderbird family,

Can you believe that we have already passed the halfway mark? As we move towards the end of the 2016-2017 school year, there is still a lot of work that has to be done. Pinellas Park Middle School still has many things going on. We want your student to be as successful as possible. Hopefully, this edition of the 'Counselors' Corner' will help you stay in the loop of what is going on at 'The Park'.

Preparing for the FSA

One of the most significant assessments that Pinellas County Students take is the Florida Standards Assessments (FSA), which has taken the place of the FCAT, Florida Comprehensive Assessment Test. This test is crucial to your student's educational career in that scores can help determine placement in core courses, are often seen as a reliable data predictor of success for District Application programs (i.e. Cambridge/Pre-AICE program), and give a snapshot of your student's achievement compared to students across Florida. FSA is often looked at as a reflection of a student's knowledge of statewide benchmarks for their grade level. Attending school, and doing homework can help students earn high grades. While these can also help students with their FSA scores, all students can improve test scores and grades just by using some test-preparation strategies. Remember, "Before anything else, preparation is the key to success" (Alexander Graham Bell). Here are some test prep strategies your student can use to prepare for the FSA:

- Create a study Plan- Create a study plan that spreads out your studying. Start early. A sample study plan could be to spend a certain amount of time everyday on FSA prep. A great resource is for students to sign up for a Khan Academy account on khanacademy.org and spend 10 minutes 2-3 times a week on this personalized learning resource to build skills that FSA targets
- Make Flash Cards and/or Review Sheets- Work with your teachers to obtain review information for the FSA. Turn the information on the review into simple flash cards. Practice +Repetition makes strength!
- The night before the tests, get eight hours of sleep.
- Get up early enough to eat a good breakfast and not be rushed. In Pinellas County, many restaurants, such as McDonalds offer students free breakfast the morning of the FSA! PPMS also always serves free, hot breakfast to all students everyday!
- Practice visualization- Close your eyes and imagine yourself taking the test, answering the questions correctly, and getting the grade you want.
- Relax, think positive thoughts, and do your best! Many students often feel anxious. Don't worry, take several slow, deep breaths and do some stretching. If you need more help prepping for the FSA or any test, please see your grade level counselor.

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Course Recovery Options and Remediation Options

If your student is not making satisfactory progress in middle school, your grade level counselor can help! Unsatisfactory progress means earning 'below a C' (D or F) in a core subject such as Language Arts, Mathematics, Social Studies, and/or Science. If you are unsure of your student's progress, please schedule a conference with your student's teachers.

You may do this through your School Counselor.

Many students are recovering failed courses through an online platform called Plato Course Recovery. If your student is enrolled in Plato, or you would like your student to be enrolled in Plato, see your School Counselor for their unique log in credentials. The program can be accessed from home for lesson completion. End of the lesson tests do

need to be completed on campus. Students can have time to do this through our ELP (Extended Learning Program) either before school or after school. ELP begins before school as early as 7:40 am and after school hours are from 4:15-5:45. If your student signs up for ELP, they will get free dinner immediately after the

program as well as the support they need to earn the best grades possible. There is also an ELP bus with limited stops that can help your child get home.

Lastly, Pinellas Park Middle also offers summer programs, including remediation courses designed to supplement students in areas of advanced math, advanced science, regular science and reading. More information will come when available.

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
