MBF'S DROP OFF- PICK UP FAQ'S

K5 School times 7:45 AM- 1:55 PM, Middle grades School times 7:45 AM- 2:15 PM.

Enrollment in our school is a privilege enjoyed by Madeira Beach Fundamental students and their families. Our students are expected to exhibit exemplary achievement and conduct while at school and outside of school within the community. We always appreciate exemplary conduct from our parent community as well, as the neighborhood and businesses which surround our school are an extension of us.

*School guidelines require all students to be picked from school up no more than **30 minutes from the end of the student day**, and immediately following participation to any end of the day student activity.*

WHAT YOU CAN DO THAT HELPS EVERYONE?

- Maintain a slow speed.
- Refrain from foul language, inappropriate gestures and remain patient and kind. Children and families are watching you.
- Refrain from smoking, or otherwise being distracted.
- Please use hands free mode on your cellular devices while in the car line.
- Close all gaps by moving forward.
- Use a dashboard name sign, a left turn signal to pass out of the line.
- Students should be drop off/ pick up ready with backpacks, folders, and music instruments in hand.
- Escort your child if parking. At no time should a student walk across parking areas without an adult.
- Arrive early, or later to avoid the heaviest levels of traffic.

PLEASE REMEMBER NOT TO:

- Use the businesses across from school for drop off and pick up purposes
- Park your car in the car circle, on sidewalks, or in staff sanctioned parking spaces.
- Please do not leave your vehicle.
- Have your children enter or exit vehicles from the driver's side.
- Text or use social media while moving in the car line. It is now against the law to operate a motor vehicle while holding your phone in a school zone while children are present. K5 families use the RED LOOP (follow red signs)

AM Drop off– 1) Enter loop at the traffic light. 2.) Follow red signs, and pull forward closing gaps. Drop off takes place near the covered PE court. **PM Pick Up**– 1) Enter loop at the traffic light. Follow red signs. 2) Pull forward to the elementary loop which will lead to elementary car circle. 3.) Pick up takes place near the covered PE court. 4.) Please display your name card with your car pool name. 5.) We will call your name over a loud speaker. 6.) Please pull all the way forward. 7.) You may pass motorists once you have your child.

Middle grade and sibling use BLUE LOOP (follow blue signs)

AM Drop off– 1.) Please loop at the light or entrance near McDonald's. 2.) Follow blue signs around field (two lanes to merge point). 3.) Pull all the way forward closing all gaps. Middle grades/ sibling drop off takes place anyplace from the gym to the crosswalk or near the elementary school front office **PM Pick Up**– 1) Follow the blue lanes around field (two lanes to merge point. 2.) Display your name card with your car pool name. 3) We will call your car pool name over a loud speaker. 4.) Pull forward to the cafeteria closing all gaps. 5.) You may pass other motorists once you have your child.

A high volume of traffic is always expected. Always arrive with a smile.

Car Line Drop Off/Pick up Reminders

Our earliest AM drop off for middle grades students is 7:15 AM, and 7:25 AM for elementary students. There is no adult supervision for students earlier than these times. If you are arriving early, please remain with your student until adult supervision is present. Our latest student pick up is 2:25 PM (K5) and 2:45 PM (middle grades).

A few other reminders include:

- Please refrain from texting while driving.
- Please close all gaps, use a dashboard name sign, and a left turn signal to pass out of the line.
- At all times please have your students drop off/ pick up ready with backpacks, folders, and music instruments in hand, and ready to exit or enter their vehicle.
- And at no time should students enter vehicles from the driver's side, nor should you get out of your vehicles when using car line.
- If you are parking to pick up or drop off in our parking lots, you must walk your student across the street. At no time should student's walk across parking lots without an adult.
- Please be reminded once more, we request (and our business community across from school request) you use are car line for drop off and pick up purposes.

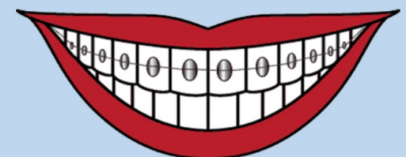

2019-2020 8th grade National Junior Honor Society Interest

NJHS is a service organization for students who exemplify and demonstrate the following traits: service, leadership, character, and citizenship. Eligible eighth grade students will be evaluated by a faculty advisory council on the basis of these traits. To be eligible for membership consideration, students must be in eighth grade and have a 3.0 grade point average on a 4.0 scale beginning with grades active in sixth grade and meet the behavioral and character requirements. If, after a student has been selected, but before the formal induction, the student is involved in an incident which places his/her qualifications in question, induction will not take place until the faculty advisory council re-evaluates his/her standing.

Students must also be able to verify at least 20 hours of community service with documentation. Acceptable forms of documentation include a letter or the form available on the website with signed documentation of the service done and number of hours. Service hours may be completed at the same place and should be signed off by a non-family member. The hours may begin at the beginning of his/her seventh grade year and need to be completed by the first day of 8th grade.

Joining us for Lunch?

Be careful when using Social Media

Have you ever been messaged online from a random stranger? Has someone tried to reach out to you on any apps or social media that you use?

There are a lot of people out there pretending to be someone they are not, also known as "Trolls". These people are trying to harass and bully others. They can be found in many different places, online forums, chat rooms, direct messages, social medial apps, etc. Sometimes these messages that Trolls send are pointless and easily forgotten. But other times their words can be serious and cause people mental and emotional problems that can last indefinitely.

When chatting with these strangers, often private information is shared. Most social media profiles include stuff such as birthdays, where you go to school, where you live and play sports. This private information allows these Trolls to keep a close eye on you, and your friends, knowing what you're doing always. This could put you in a very dangerous situation. Posting things about your specific location, like address information, may allow a Troll to find you. Also posting that you are on vacation would allow a stranger to know your house is unoccupied and a possible break in could happen.

What should you do if a stranger reaches out to you or sends you anything unusual? First, you should never open their messages and ignore and block them. If they continue to reach out you should tell a parent, adult, teacher or someone you trust. Never under any circumstances send them any personal information. Never participate in their bullying and harassing of others.

Whether you are on Instagram, online chat rooms, gaming chat rooms, or anywhere online, the more you post the more a stranger can learn about you.

Keep yourself and your friends safe by sharing this information with them.

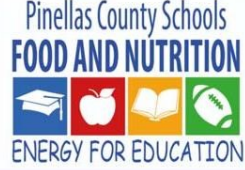

Say Something App

As you may know secondary students (grades 6-12) from across our district can use the Say Something Anonymous Reporting System. This system (via app., internet, or telephone) allows students to submit secure and anonymous safety concerns to help identify and intervene at-risk individuals or behaviors. Students can report observed threats, behaviors, actions and harassment taking place. The app also allows students to type in a description of what they saw or heard, and attach photos, videos or screenshots for example, of a social media post. Tips get triaged at a national call center by professional crisis counselors, who can immediately involve local police and/or school officials. The counselors can also message back and forth with the tipster.

When our students act as the eyes and ears of the school, concerns can be addressed. We want our students to See Something, and Say Something. Leads received recently have helped us to identify concerns across our campus and act upon them. While not all leads can be proven, or even factual, a venue is provided for our students to share.

Unfortunately some students may misuse the Say Something Anonymous Reporting System. While all reports are investigated, students may submit recent prank reports giving intentional false accusations and information for the purposes of getting another student in trouble. These reports can trigger an investigation from the national call center to local police and/or school officials. And, when prank reports are received, services which could be provided to a true emergency are redirected.

Please have conversations with your child about Seeing Something, and Saying Something, but also remind them, that like calling 911 in an emergency, any misuse or abuse of this system is strictly prohibited, and, when prank reports are received, services which could be provided to a true emergency are redirected.

Student Homework

Homework may be assigned any day of the week. Students who do not have homework assignments completed and in class by the assigned date will receive two demerits. However, the student will be given credit for the portion of the homework that is completed. When parents/guardians sign a homework paper, it is an indication that the parent/guardian has looked over the assignment for accuracy, completion, neatness, name, and appropriate responses. Students whose homework does not have the required parent/guardian signature will receive one demerit. Students who do not bring the necessary materials to class will receive one demerit. Students will not be allowed to use the school phone to request forgotten materials be brought to school. Homework which is forgotten at home and brought to school by the parent/guardian will not be delivered to the classroom.
