School Vision: 100% student success

School Mission: Madeira Beach Fundamental will provide a rigorous student-centered learning environment to ensure 100% student success by working collaboratively with all faculty, staff, and community stakeholders.

To accomplish this mission, Madeira Beach Fundamental has 7 Goals:

- 1. 76% of our students scored at the proficient level or above as evidenced in the Spring, 2018 English Language Arts Florida Standards Assessment. We expect our performance level to be 80% of students achieving ELA proficiency by Spring 2019.
- 87% of our students scored at the proficient level or above as evidenced in the Spring, 2018 Mathematics Florida Standards Assessment. We expect our performance level to be 89% of students achieving Mathematics proficiency by Spring, 2019.
- 86% of our students scored at the proficient level or above as evidenced in SSA proficiency (level 3 and above). We expect our performance level to be 90% by May 2019.
- 4. 90% of our students achieved at the proficient (Level 3 and above) as measured by the 2019 Spring EOC Civics Assessment. We expect our performance to increase from 90% to 93%, as measured by the 2019 Spring EOC Civics Assessment.
- 5. 100% of students will be provided with opportunities for physical movement on a daily basis to maintain student engagement in content.
- 6. The percent of all students earning credit for acceleration coursework will increase from 81% to 85%, as measured by qualifying course credit scores and/or industry certifications earned as measured by the *Acceleration Rate.
- 7. 100% of our students will be provided restorative practices (community circles) on a regular basis to increase community building opportunities and reduce the number and percent of discipline incidents for each student subgroup.

Welcome Back Students and Parents

As we start this new school year at Madeira Beach Fundamental, let us strive to improve our schoolwide attendance. We need for each parent to remember to send written documentation for any absence their child may incur for students K-8. There are 3 ways you may do this: 1) use the attendance icon, "Report of Absence" on the school website to write your note, 2) Provide a Doctor's note for any appointment /illness your child may have, or 3) write a parent note giving the reason your child was absent.(Note: Parents are allowed to write up to 5 notes.)

All absences are coded "PENDING" until documentation is received. Pending is like an unexcused absence and needs to be cleared up within 48 hours of the absence.

Once a child misses enough days to equal 10%, parent will receive written notification from the school encouraging them to have their child in school as much as possible to enhance their academic achievement.

"Start With Hello" Initiative

During the week of September 24-28 our school will be participating in the "Start With Hello" initiative. This Sandy Hook Promise program is a fun and easy method to help our students make a dif-



ference with their peers in a simple and impactful way. It encourages them to take small but powerful actions to promote connectedness and inclusion, and to identify and help others who are showing signs of social isolation.

Social isolation is the overwhelming feeling of being left out, lonely or treated like you are invisible. Young people who feel this way may pull away from society, struggle with learning and social development, or chose to hurt themselves or others.

Our goal is to create a culture of inclusion and connectedness; plus, encourage students to reach out to include those who may be feeling isolated. We feel this is a perfect opportunity to welcome students back to school and to connect with each other.

If you have any questions or concerns, please reach out to your child's school counselor.

Car line reminders

Our school times are 7:45 AM- 2:15 PM middle grades students, and 7:55 AM- 1:55 PM elementary grades, with student drop off, and pick up on site, only, and not at the businesses across from school! Please be reminded the earliest student drop off in the morning is 7:15 AM (middle grades), and 7:25 AM (K5). The latest student pick up times are 2:25 PM K5, and 2:45 PM middle grades.

Please be mindful that our school hosts an onsite before and after school program provided thru the YMCA. This program is especially helpful for our families who are in need of finding child care in the windows of time when the school is not in session. As a reminder, fundamental guidelines require parents to pick their child up no more than 30 minutes from the end of the student day. Not doing so can lead to the school intervention and appeals committee and potential dismissal from our school. We request (and our business community across from school request) you use are car line for drop off and pick up purposes.

Now six friendly reminders for car line:

- At no time should students ever walk across parking lots without an adult to chaperone them.
- Please remember to close all gaps and always pull forward when directed.
- Use a dashboard name sign at student pick up. This is especially helpful so those calling names can just walk by your car and say your last name without stopping to ask you to roll down a window.
- Use a left turn signal to pass out of the line, and have your students drop off/ pick up ready with backpacks, folders, and music instruments in hand, and ready to exit or enter their vehicle.
- At no time should students enter vehicles from the driver's side, nor should you get out of your vehicles when using car line.
- Please refrain from cell phone use when the car is in motion.

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Dear MBFS community,

As a result of the Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School Public Safety Act a number of safety measures have been put into place in Pinellas County Schools which will result in changes at schools. One of these ways at Madeira Beach Fundamental is I am incredibly pleased to announce that we have a new school resource officer. Join me in welcoming Schools Police Officer Barry Colbath. Officer Colbath has an extensive 37 year resume in local law enforcement.

At school we are all vigilant about students and staff. Our teachers, and student services staff are trained to handle crisis responses. This preschool all staff participated in safety trainings to learn how to take care of each other, and our students. Our school community holds monthly safety drills to prepare for emergencies all types. When any student or staff member needs additional support we provide community referrals. On our physical site, all exterior school doors remain locked at all times. Our school offices are equipped with secure storefront glass, and all visitors must be cleared to enter secure areas of the school through Badge Pass to receive a visitor's pass.

I am asking for your continued help too. Let's wrap your arms around our school. If we surround our school with people like you, you can help our children build a school community where acts of violence become nothing more than a dim and distant memory.

How can you help? If your child uses social media, please use this as an opportunity to remind your child of appropriate social media use. Please monitor the information they are sharing with their peers. Social media tends to feed rumors. Please remember to "Say something, if you see something." Mentor a student, or work in a classroom. Volunteer here at school. If you need help with this please contact our Family & Community Liaison, Stacie Allen. Additionally, we could use your help in the mornings and afternoon with covering some of the gates on campus and help with the parking lot. If you are willing to help out for two mornings or afternoons a month, or longer if you can, you will receive membership credit for the month of September. 
